

(2) The *Waterworks Clauses Act 1952*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section thirty-three of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsection (1) and substituting therefor the following subsection:—

Undertakers to affix fire-plugs in mains.

“(1) The undertakers may, and at the request—

(a) in a fire district of the fire brigade board and at the undertaker’s expense; and

(b) elsewhere of the council and at its expense,

shall, fix proper fire-plugs in the main and other pipes belonging to them, or erect and connect therewith pillar hydrants and stand pipes, at such places as may be most proper and convenient for the supply of water for extinguishing any fire which may break out within the limits of the special Act.”.

3 Section thirty-five of the Principal Act is repealed.

SUNDAY OBSERVANCE.

No. 60 of 1962.

AN ACT to amend the *Sunday Observance Act 1908*.
[11 December 1962.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Sunday Observance Act 1962*.

Short title and citation.

(2) The *Sunday Observance Act 1908*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section eleven of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by inserting after paragraph X of subsection (1) thereof the following paragraph:—

Works of necessity or mercy not prohibited.

“XA The delivery for sale, and the sale, subject to the provisions of the *Shops Act 1925*, between the hours of nine o’clock in the forenoon and nine o’clock in the afternoon of—

(a) any newspaper or edition of a newspaper that is printed for the purpose of publication or sale on Sundays: and

(b) any newspaper or edition of a newspaper published on a Saturday that is specified in an order in force for the time being under subsection (8) of section sixteen of that Act:”; and

(b) by adding at the end of paragraph XII of that subsection the words “, and the delivery of bread to a retailer for sale to the public:”.

3 The second schedule to the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the following items:—

- “ 11. Eggs
- “ 12. Honey
- “ 13. Breakfast cereals
- “ 14. Butter
- “ 15. Cut flowers
- “ 16. Photographic films ”.

Adaptation of
amendments

reprint of
Principal Act.

4—(1) On and after the date of the reprinting of the Principal Act this Act is to have effect as if from section two the symbols “x”, “XA”, and “XII” were omitted and the symbols “(j)”, “(k)”, and “(m)”, respectively, were substituted therefor, and on and from that date the Principal Act, as amended by this Act, shall be construed accordingly.

(2) The Principal Act and this Act are, by force of this subsection, amended to such extent as may be necessary to give effect to the foregoing provisions of this section.

(3) Subject to this section, the provisions of this Act remain in full force and effect as if this section had not been enacted.

(4) In this section, “date of the reprinting of the Principal Act” means the date of the giving of the certificate printed, pursuant to section six of the *Reprint of Statutes Act 1954*, in the volume of reprinted Acts published pursuant to that Act in which the reprint of the Principal Act is included.

HOBART MARINE BOARD (ROYAL VISIT EXPENDITURE).

AN ACT to authorize the expenditure of moneys by the Marine Board of Hobart for purposes connected with the visit to this State of Her Majesty the Queen. [11 December 1962.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—
