AN ACT to amend the *Scenery Preservation Act* 1915. [20 December, 1945.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Scenery Preservation Act* 1945. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Scenery Preservation Act* 1915\*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

A.D. 1945. **2** Subsection (2) of section seventeen of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting the words "being not less than five thousand pounds" (in paragraph II.);
- (b) by omitting the words "twenty-one" and substituting therefor the words "ninety-nine"; and
- (c) by omitting the words "may think fit" after Minister (last occurring) and substituting therefor the words ", on the recommendation of the Board, may determine.":
