

STATUTORY SALARIES.

No. 61 of 1971.

AN ACT to prescribe the salaries to be paid to the holders of certain offices and to repeal or amend certain enactments. [17 November 1971.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1** This Act may be cited as the *Statutory Salaries Act 1971*. Short title.
- 2** There is payable to a person for the time being holding an office specified in the first column of the first schedule an annual salary calculated at the rate specified opposite to that office in the second column of that schedule. Salaries of judges.
- 3** There is payable to a person for the time being holding an office specified in the first column of the second schedule an annual salary calculated at the rate specified opposite to that office in the second column of that schedule. Salaries of stipendiary magistrates.
- 4**—(1) There is payable to a person for the time being holding an office specified in the first column of the third schedule an annual salary calculated at the rate specified opposite to that office in the second column of that schedule. Salaries of holders of certain statutory offices.
- (2) In addition to the salary referred to in subsection (1) of this section, the Auditor-General and the Public Service Commissioner may each be paid such allowances, if any, as the Governor may approve.
- 5** The salary that is payable to a person to whom section two, or section three, or section four relates is payable out of the Consolidated Revenue (which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly). Appropriation.
- 6**—(1) The *Judges' Salaries Act 1920* is repealed. Repeals and amendments.
- (2) Section five of the *Audit Act 1918* is repealed.
- (3) The Acts that are specified in the first column of the fourth schedule are amended as respectively specified in the second column of that schedule.

<i>Stipendiary Magistrates Act 1969</i>	Section 10— Omit subsection (1). From subsection (2) omit "A" and substitute "In addition to the salary prescribed in the <i>Statutory Salaries Act 1971</i> , a". At the end of the section add the following subsection:— “(3) An allowance that is payable by virtue of subsection (2) of this section is payable out of the Consolidated Revenue (which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly).”.

AN ACT to amend the *Mines Inspection Act 1968* and certain other Acts. [17 November 1971.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Mines Inspection Act 1971*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Mines Inspection Act 1968* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
