STATUTORY SALARIES.

No. 61 of 1971.

AN ACT to prescribe the salaries to be paid to the holders of certain offices and to repeal or amend [17 November 1971.] certain enactments.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Statutory Salaries Act 1971.

Short title.

2 There is payable to a person for the time being holding an salaries of office specified in the first column of the first schedule an annual judges. salary calculated at the rate specified opposite to that office in the second column of that schedule.

3 There is payable to a person for the time being holding an salaries of office specified in the first column of the second schedule an annual stipendiary magistrates, salary calculated at the rate specified opposite to that office in the second column of that schedule.

4—(1) There is payable to a person for the time being holding an Salaries of office specified in the first column of the third schedule an annual certain statusalary calculated at the rate specified opposite to that office in the tory offices. second column of that schedule.

- (2) In addition to the salary referred to in subsection (1) of this section, the Auditor-General and the Public Service Commissioner may each be paid such allowances, if any, as the Governor may approve.
- 5 The salary that is payable to a person to whom section two, Appropriaor section three, or section four relates is payable out of the tion. Consolidated Revenue (which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly).
 - **6**—(1) The Judges' Salaries Act 1920 is repealed.

Repeals and amendments.

- (2) Section five of the Audit Act 1918 is repealed.
- (3) The Acts that are specified in the first column of the fourth schedule are amended as respectively specified in the second column of that schedule.
