AN ACT to amend the *Towns Act* 1934.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Towns Act* (No. 2) 1945. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Towns Act* 1934\*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section forty-eight of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after the words “forty-eight A” in subsection (2) the words “, or the owner of the land has deposited with the council an approved bank guarantee or a sum sufficient to construct, or complete the construction of, such street in accordance with that section.” Conditions precedent for opening of private streets.

**3** Section forty-eight B of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by inserting at the commencement of subsection (1) the words “subject to subsection (1A),”; and

(b) by inserting after subsection (1) the following subsection:—

“(1A) Where the owner of any land has, in pursuance of subsection (2) of section forty-eight, deposited with the council an approved bank guarantee or a sum sufficient to construct or complete the construction of a private street, the council shall construct, or, as the case may be, complete the construction of, that private street, within twelve months after the date on which it notifies its approval of the plans and specifications for the construction thereof or such further time as the Minister may, in any particular case, approve.”.
