

AN ACT to consolidate and amend the Law 1911. relating to the Office of Agent-General for Tasmania. [21 December, 1911.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of . Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act—

Short title and commencement,

A.D.

- 1. May be cited as "The Agent-General Act, 1911":
- II. Shall come into operation on the Thirtieth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

Agent-General.

Interpretation.

2 In this Act the expression "the Minister" means the Premier of the State or the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering this Act.

Repeal.

3 From and after the commencement of this Act "The Agent-General's Act, 1885," is hereby repealed.

Agent-General

4 The Governor in Council may from time to time appoint some person to be the Agent-General for Tasmania in the United Kingdom and elsewhere.

Term of office.

- 5—(1) The Agent-General shall be appointed to hold office, subject to this Act, for a period not exceeding Three years from the date of appointment, and shall be eligible for reappointment.
- (2) The Agent-General may at any time be removed from office by the Governor in Council for misbehaviour or incapacity, or upon a joint address of both Houses of the Parliament.

Duties of the Agent-General.

6 The Agent-General shall—

- I. Act as representative and resident agent of Tasmania in the United Kingdom, and in that capacity exercise such powers and perform such duties as are conferred upon and assigned to him by the Governor in Council:
- 11. Carry out such instructions as he receives from the Minister respecting the commercial, financial, and general interests of Tasmania in the United Kingdom and elsewhere.

Salary and allowances of Agent-General.

7—(1) The salary of the Agent-General shall be One thousand Pounds a year, and shall be paid to him monthly out of the Consolidated Revenue, which is hereby appropriated for that purpose accordingly.

Travelling expenses.

(2) There shall be placed at the disposal of the Agent-General each year such sum as Parliament may annually appropriate under the head of "Contingencies" for expenditure by him for the purposes named in the Act of Appropriation.

Agent-General may appoint officers.

- 8—(1) The Agent-General may appoint officers for the performance of any duties required in the execution of this Act.
- (2) Such appointments shall be made in accordance with such instructions in that behalf as he receives from the Minister.
- (3) Every such appointment shall cease to have effect at the expiration of Six months from the date of appointment, unless the Governor in Council in the meantime confirms the appointment.
- (4) The salaries of such officers shall be paid out of moneys to be appropriated by Parliament,

Agent-General.

(5) Officers so appointed shall not be subject to "The Public Service A.D. 1911. Act, 1905."

(6) No officer so appointed shall be entitled to any compensation by 5 Ed. VII. No. 9. reason of the loss of his office or the diminution of his emoluments.

9 The Governor in Council may from time to time make regula-Regulations, tions prescribing all matters which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to this Act.
