AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and to appropriate the Supplies granted for such Year in this Session of the Parliament. [22 January, 1915.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Appropriation Act, 1914-15."

Issue and application of

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the Thirtieth day of £327,269 58, 11d. June, One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, the sum of Three hundred and twenty-seven thousand two hundred and sixty-nine Pounds Five Shillings and Eleven Pence.

Appropriation of supplies.

3 All sums granted by this Act and "The Supply Act (No. 1), 1914-15," and "The Supply Act (No. 2), 1914-15," out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty, amounting, as appears by the First Schedule to this Act, in the aggregate to the sum of Six hundred and forty-three thousand one hundred and seventy-nine Pounds Five Shillings and Eleven Pence, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of "The Supply Act (No. 1), 1914-15," for the purposes and services expressed in the Second Schedule.

Moneys payable by warrant of the Governor.

4 The Treasurer shall issue and pay the several sums to such persons for the purposes in the said Second Schedule mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant under his hand, from time to time orders and directs; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in accounts.

5 The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
