

Fees to be paid for examination of accounts of local authorities. Recovery of fees. Fees to be paid into Consolidated Revenue. Regulations.

AN ACT to amend "The Audit Act, 1918." 1924. [31 March, 1924.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :---

2 After Section 32 of "The Audit Act, 1918," the following section 32a is inserted :--

"32a—(1) There shall be payable to the Treasurer by each local authority, out of its revenues, a fee in respect of any examination by the Auditor-General under this Act of the accounts of such local authority, and such fee shall, in the case of—

- I. A municipality under "The Local Government Act, 1906": or
 - 11. A marine board or harbour trust subject to the provisions of "The Marine Act, 1921"---

not exceed Two Guineas per day for each officer: or

111. The municipal council of a city or any other public body be such as may be agreed upon by the Governor and such council or public body in such case, or, in the absence of such agreement, in accordance with a scale to be prescribed in each case.

Recovery of fees.

Fees to be paid into Consolidated Revenue. Regulations. (2) The Auditor-General shall send by post to the local authority concerned an account of any fee payable by it to the Treasurer under Subsection (1) of this section, and in default of the payment by such local authority to the Treasurer of the amount thereof within One month after such account has been so sent, such amount may be recovered by the Treasurer from the local body concerned, as a debt due to His Majesty.

(3) All fees received by the Treasurer under this Section shall be paid into, and form part of, the Consolidated Revenue.

(4) The Governor may make regulations prescribing, in accordance with Subsection (1) of this section, the fees to be paid thereunder by local authorities to the Treasurer in respect of examinations referred to in the said subsection, and for any other purpose which the Governor may deem necessary for giving effect to the provisions of this section."
