

AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of the 1930. Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Year ending on the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and to appropriate the Supplies granted for such Year in this Session of Parliament. $\lceil 3 \; December, \; 1930. \rceil$

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Appropriation Act, 1930-31."

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, the sum of Seven hundred £751,720 5s. 7d. and fifty-one thousand seven hundred and twenty Pounds Five Shillings and Seven Pence.

Appropriation of supplies. 21 Geo. V. No. 1.

3 All sums granted by this Act, and the Supply Act (No. 1), 1930-31, out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty, amounting, as appears by the First Schedule to this Act, in the aggregate to the sum of One million five hundred and five thousand one hundred and thirteen Pounds Five Shillings and Seven Pence, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of that Act for the purposes and services expressed in the Second Schedule to this Act.
