

AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of the 1931. Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Year ending on the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and to appropriate the Supplies granted for that Year in this Session of [8 December, 1931.] Parliament.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title. 1 This Act may be cited as "The Appropriation Act, 1931-32"

#### A.D. 1931.

Issue and application of £638,319 4s, 1d.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, the sum of Six hundred and thirty eight thousand three hundred and nineteen Pounds Four Shillings and One Penny.

Appropriation of supplies.

3 All sums granted by this Act, and the Supply Act (No. 1), 1931-32, out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply 22 Geo. V. No. 3. granted to His Majesty, amounting, as appears by the First Schedule to this Act, in the aggregate to the sum of One million three hundred and sixty-nine thousand nine hundred and sixty-four Pounds Four Shillings and One Penny, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of that Act for the purposes and services expressed in the Second Schedule to this Act.
