AN ACT to amend "The Agent-General's A.D. 1903. Act, 1885." [25 September, 1903.]

TE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Agent-General's Amendment Short Title. Act, 1903."

2 In this Act the expression "the said Act" means "The Agent- Interpretation. 49 Vict. No. 19. General's Act, 1885."

3 Section Five of the said Act and the Schedule thereto are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Section and Schedule shall No. 19 and be deemed to be and may be cited as Section Five of the said Act and Schedule the Schedule thereto respectively, that is to say:

"5 Upon the appointment of an Agent-General under this Act there Salary of shall and may be yearly appropriated, issued, and applied out of the Agent-General Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State of Tasmania a sum not and Staff.
