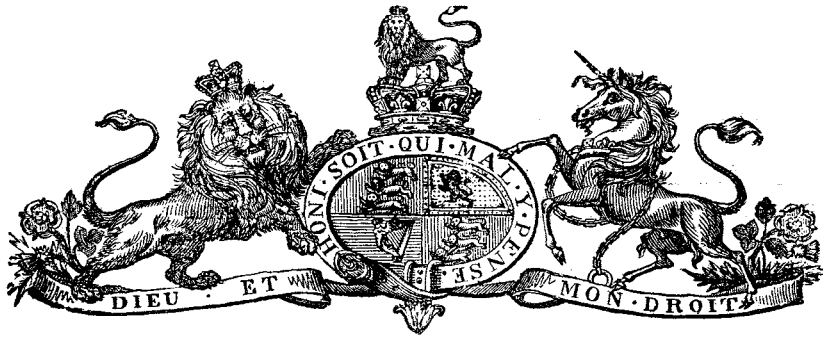

AN ACT to amend the Act for regulating Sales  
by Auction. [23 September, 1859.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** In any case in which, after the commencement of this Act, Two or more persons carrying on business, or purposing to carry on business, in partnership together as Auctioneers apply to be licensed as Auctioneers, under the provisions of the Act of Council of the 6th *William* the 4th, No. 6, each of such persons shall be liable to pay the same amount of Licence-money as he would have been liable to pay if he had applied to be so licensed separately.

Auctioneer Partners each liable to payment of Licence Fee.

**2** It shall not be lawful for any Auctioneer to sell Liquor by Auction in any quantity less than Seven Quarts in One lot, nor unless notice in writing of the time and place of the intended sale has been given by such Auctioneer to the Superintendent of Police, if such sale is intended to be held in *Hobart Town* or *Launceston*, and if elsewhere, to the District Constable or other Officer of Police of equal or superior rank stationed at or nearest to the place where such sale is intended to be held, Twenty-four hours at the least previously to the actual commencement of such sale; and every Auctioneer offending

Auctioneers not to sell Liquor in a less quantity than 7 Quarts, and to give notice of Sale of Liquor.

against the provisions of this Section shall incur a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds; and for the purposes of this Section the term "Liquor" shall have the same meaning as the same term in *The Licensing Act*; and in any proceeding under this Section it shall not be necessary for the complainant to prove that the defendant is an Auctioneer.

**3** Sections 5 and 8 of the Act of Council of the 6th *William* the 4th, No. 6, are hereby repealed.

Acts to be read  
together.

**4** This Act and the said Act of the 6th *William* the 4th, No. 6, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.

Commencement  
of Act.

**5** This Act shall commence and take effect on the First day of *October*, 1859.

Short Title.

**6** In referring to the said Act of the 6th *William* the 4th, No. 6, or this Act, it shall be sufficient to use the respective expressions, *The Auction Act*, and *The Auction Amendment Act*.
