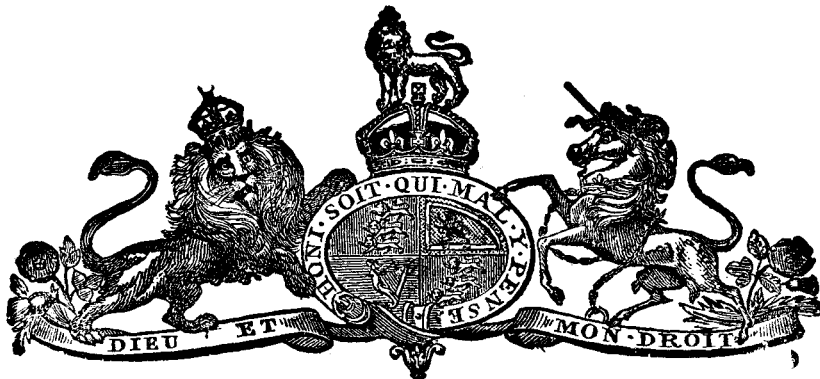

AN ACT to amend the Amusements Duties Act, 1916. [24 November, 1925.] A.D. 1925.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1**—(1) This Act may be cited as “The Amusements Duties Act, Short title. 1925.”
- (2) The Amusements Duties Act, 1916, is herein called “the Principal Act.” Principal Act.

- 2** Section Fourteen of the Principal Act is hereby amended as follows:— Amendment of

- i. By inserting the word “or” at the end of Paragraph v. thereof: and

ii. By inserting the following Paragraph vi. after Paragraph v. thereof:—

“vi. That the whole of the net proceeds of the amusement are, or will be, devoted to—

- (a) The erection, maintenance, or furnishing of halls for public purposes, or for memorial halls for the use of soldiers or sailors who served in the war, which commenced on the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen: or
 - (b) Such purposes as are, in the opinion of the Commissioner, either religious or public: or
 - (c) Such funds of a society or association not carried on for the profit or gain of the individual members thereof, as the society or association sets apart to provide sick, accident, or funeral benefits for or on behalf of any of its members—
- and that the amusement is not provided directly or indirectly for the financial benefit of any person connected with the promotion of the amusement, or of any person employed or engaged by that person for the purpose of the amusement.”

Amendment of
Section 15 of the
Principal Act.

3 Section Fifteen of the Principal Act is hereby amended by inserting the words “or unforeseen circumstances” after the word “conditions” in the second line of the proviso to the said section.
