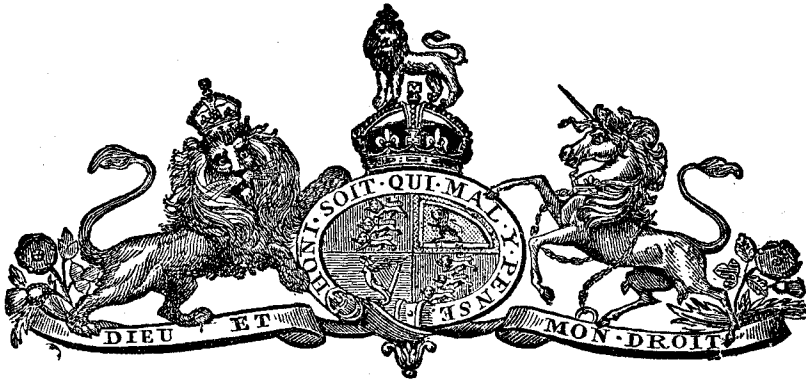

AN ACT to provide for the Payment of a Pension to Senior Constable *Albert Henry Jackson*, or to his Dependants, in the event of his death in certain circumstances.

WHEREAS Senior Constable *Albert Henry Jackson*, in the execution of his duty, rendered exceptional and meritorious service to the State during the disastrous floods which occurred in the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine:

PREAMBLE.

And whereas the said officer has since contracted serious physical disabilities, and it is believed that the same are primarily due to the exceptional strain and exposure to which he was subjected in the performance of such services as aforesaid:

Albert Henry Jackson Pension.

And whereas it is desirable that adequate provision should be made for the support of the said Senior Constable *Albert Henry Jackson* and his dependants:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as “The *Albert Henry Jackson Pension Act, 1931.*”

Grant of pension of £260 to *Albert Henry Jackson.*

2—(1) There shall be payable to *Albert Henry Jackson*, retired Senior Constable in the Police Force of this State, an annual pension of Two hundred and sixty Pounds.

(2) Such pension as aforesaid shall be payable, as from the twelfth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, during the incapacity of the said *Albert Henry Jackson.*

(3) In the event at any time of the said *Albert Henry Jackson* recovering from such incapacity as aforesaid and of his restoration to office, the said pension shall cease to be payable.

(4) So long as any pension is payable to him under this Act, the said *Albert Henry Jackson* shall submit himself for examination by a board of three medical practitioners, to be nominated by the Governor, at such times, not exceeding once in every year, as the Minister may require.

(5) If at any time such board shall certify that the said *Albert Henry Jackson* has recovered sufficiently to undertake the duties of any office which is available and offered to him, the pension payable to him under this Act may be reviewed by the Governor, and the amount thereof reduced to such sum as the Governor may order during any period for which the said *Albert Henry Jackson* remains in such office, or, being certified as fit to perform the duties thereof, fails to do so.

Grant to widow and children in certain events.

3 If the said *Albert Henry Jackson* shall die without having been restored to office, leaving his wife, *Mary Jane Margaret Jackson*, or any child under the age of sixteen years, him surviving, there shall be payable—

I. To the said *Mary Jane Margaret Jackson* an annual pension of Fifty Pounds during her widowhood: and

II. To each and every child of the said *Albert Henry Jackson*, who is under the age of sixteen years, an annual pension of Twenty Pounds until such child attains the age of sixteen years.

Albert Henry Jackson Pension.

4—(1) Every such pension as aforesaid shall be paid **A.D. 1981.**
monthly to the person entitled thereto, or to such other person
as the person so entitled may appoint, in writing, to receive
the same, except in the case of pensions payable to an infant
child, which shall be paid to the said *Mary Jane Margaret*
Jackson, or such person as she may so appoint, and shall be
expended by her for the benefit of such infant child.

Payment of
pensions.

(2) In the event of the death of the said *Mary Jane Margaret*
Jackson the pension payable to any infant child shall be paid
to the Public Trustee, and shall be expended by him for the
benefit of such child.

(3) Upon the death of any pensioner under this Act, any
pension to which he was entitled and which is due or accruing
unpaid at the date of such person's death, may be paid to the
said *Mary Jane Margaret Jackson* or to the Public Trustee, as
the case may be, and expended for the benefit of the surviving
pensioners under this Act.

5 All pensions payable under this Act shall be paid out of **Appropriation.**
the Consolidated Revenue, which, to the necessary extent, is
hereby appropriated accordingly.
