TOURIST ACCOMMODATION LOANS.

No. 18 of 1955.

AN ACT to amend the Tourist Accommodation Loans Act 1945. [6 June, 1955.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Tourist Accommoda-Short title and tion Loans Act 1955.

(2) The Tourist Accommodation Loans Act 1945 is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Financial provisions.

2 Section six of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) the numerals "150,000" and substituting therefor the numerals "250,000".

JUDGES' SALARIES.

No. 19 of 1955.

AN ACT to amend the Judges' Salaries Act 1920. [6 June, 1955.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title, citation, and commencement.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Judges' Salaries Act 1955.
- (2) The Judges' Salaries Act 1920, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of January 1955.
- 2 Section two of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Judges' salaries.

- "2 There shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue (which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly)—
 - (a) to the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Justice, a salary at the rate of four thousand pounds a year; and
 - (b) to each person for the time being holding the office of puisne judge, a salary at the rate of three thousand five hundred pounds a year.".
