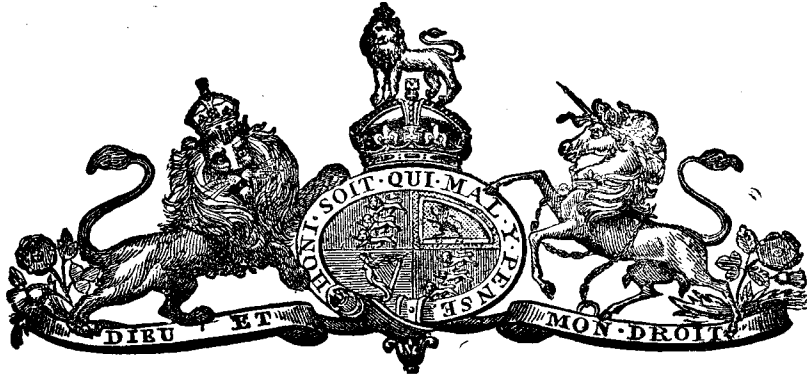

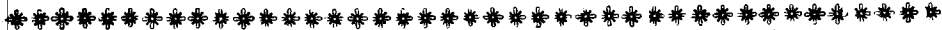

AN ACT to declare the Law with respect to Ancient Lights. A.D. 1910.  
[25 August, 1910.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as “The Ancient Lights Declaratory Act, 1910.” Short title.

**2** From and after the commencement of this Act, no right to the access or use of light to or for any building shall be capable of coming into existence by reason only of the enjoyment of such access or use for any period, or of any presumption of a lost grant based upon such enjoyment.
