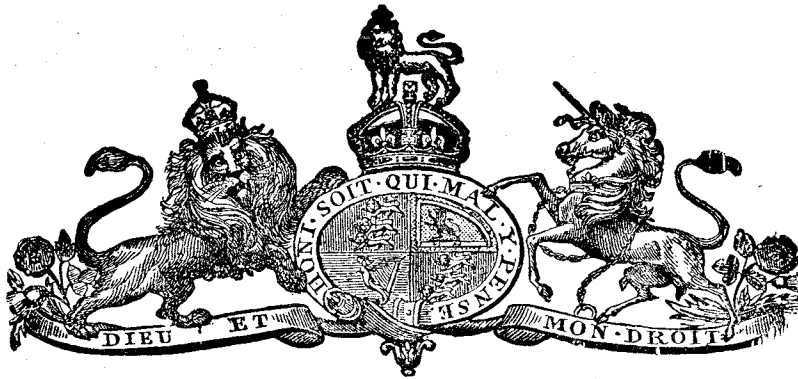

AN ACT to authorise the Trustees of the Anzac Memorial Hostel at Launceston to allow certain persons to use and occupy such Hostel, and to manage and conduct the same for certain purposes.

WHEREAS the land and buildings situated at Launceston aforesaid, and known as "The Anzac Memorial Hostel," together with the furniture, fittings, and appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining are vested in *William Coogan, Alexander Thomson Cruickshank, and Robert Lewis Parker*, as trustees upon the trusts set forth in a certain deed, poll, or declaration of trust under their hands and seals dated the Thirtieth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen:

PREAMBLE.

And whereas the said trustees are unable to carry on the abovenamed institution as at present constituted with the funds at their disposal, and the Launceston Sub-branch of The Returned Sailors' and Soldiers' Imperial League of Australia has agreed with the said trustees to carry on the said institution:

*Anzac Memorial Hostel.*

And whereas doubts have arisen as to the powers of the said trustees to give effect to such agreement, and it is desirable to empower them so to do :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Short title.

**1** This Act may be cited as “The Anzac Memorial Hostel Act, 1924.”

Power to trustees to delegate in an agreement, &c.

**2—(1)** It shall be lawful for the said *William Coogan, Alexander Thomson Cruickshank, and Robert Lewis Parker* or other the trustees for the time being of the above mentioned property, from time to time to enter into an agreement with the committee for the time being of the Launceston Sub-branch of the Returned Sailors' and Soldiers' Imperial League of Australia for the conduct, carrying on, management, and maintenance of the above mentioned institution for such purposes, and upon, and subject to, such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon between the said parties, notwithstanding that the terms of such agreement or any of them may not be in conformity with any of the provisions as to the management of such institution contained in the above recited declaration of trust.

(2) For the purposes of this Act the said trustees may from time to time, allow such committee as aforesaid to use and occupy all or any of such land, premises, and property as aforesaid for such term or terms and upon and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the said trustees may think fit.

(3) Except as herein otherwise provided the provisions of the said recited declaration of trust shall apply to the said trust property.
