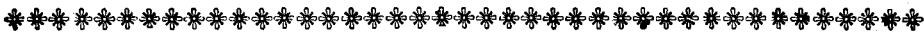

AN ACT to amend *The Barristers and Attorneys Admission Act.* [20 February, 1867.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend *The Barristers and Attorneys Admission Act*: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

1 So much of the Seventh Section of *The Barristers and Attorneys Admission Act* as relates to the examination in General Literature of Associates of Arts, being Candidates for admission as Barristers, Attorneys, Solicitors, and Proctors of the Supreme Court of *Tasmania*, is hereby repealed.

Provisions of 27 Vict., No. 25, Sect. 7 as to examination in General Literature of Articled Clerks being Associates of Arts repealed. Associates of Arts to be examined in Law only.

2 From and after the passing of this Act, every Candidate for admission as a Barrister, Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor of the said Court, who has taken or who may hereafter take the Degree of Associate of Arts, shall be examined in Law only and not in General Literature: Provided that such Candidate shall produce to the Board of Examiners under the provisions of the said Act a Certificate that he has passed an examination in Latin and Pure Mathematics to the satisfaction of the Examiners for such Degree.

3 A Candidate for admission as a Barrister, Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor of the said Court may at any time during the period of his Articleship claim to be examined in General Literature, and shall not be compelled to serve his full time before such examination takes place, anything in the said Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

4 This Act and *The Barristers and Attorneys Admission Act*, except in so far as the same is altered by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.

Short Title.

5 In referring to this Act it shall be sufficient to use the expression *The Barristers and Attorneys Admission Act, No. 2*.
