AN ACT to authorise the Loan of Two hundred Pounds to the Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the Municipality of Bruni, in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," and for other purposes. [17 December, 1912.]

W HEREAS the Warden, councillors, and electors of the Munici- PREAMBLE. pality of Bruni are desirous of fencing and otherwise improving the public recreation ground at Alonnah, and of erecting a public hall thereon and furnishing the same, and are desirous of obtaining the necessary money to enable them to do so under the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890":

And whereas a petition, signed by a majority of the ratepayers within all that portion of the Lunawanna Ward of the municipality which is situate to the north and east of the property occupied by W. H. Vaughan, was received by the Municipal Council on Saturday, October Nineteenth, One thousand nine hundred and twelve, requesting the said Council to take the necessary steps to procure a loan of Two hundred Pounds for the purposes abovenamed:

And whereas a majority of the ratepayers within that portion of the Lunawanna Ward above described expressed in their petition to the Council their approval of the proposal to obtain the said loan, and their willingness to take the responsibility for providing the interest and sinking fund that may be required in connection with the said loan, and that it is consequently unnecessary to take any poll of the ratepayers within that area:

Be it therefore enacted by this Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as "The Bruni Municipality Loan Act, 1912."

Interpretation.

2 In this Act—

"The Corporation" means the Warden, councillors, and electors of the Municipality of Bruni:

"The Council" means the Council of the said municipality.

Power to borrow.

3 It shall be lawful for the Council, on behalf of the Corporation, to borrow under the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890." any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole Two hundred Pounds, for the purpose of defraying the cost and expenses of and incidental to the fencing and improving of the public recreation ground at Alonnah, and erecting a public hall thereon, and furnishing the same, and of the preparation and passing of this Act.

Power of Governor to lend,

4 It shall be lawful for the Governor to grant in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole Two hundred Pounds, as a loan to the Corporation upon the security of all its revenues for the purpose of defraying the cost and expenses mentioned in the last preceding section; and any such sum shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose: Provided that it shall not be necessary to lay before either House of Parliament plans and specifications of the proposed works nor the report of the Engineer-in-Chief thereon, as provided in Section Two of the said Act; but before any part of such loan as aforesaid shall be advanced to the Council plans and specifications of the proposed works and building, together with a report by the Engineer-in-Chief upon the probable cost thereof, the suitability of the site proposed therefor, the sufficiency of the plans and specifications, and upon such other matters connected

with the works as the Engineer-in-Chief may deem it desirable to refer A.D. 1912 to in his said report, and that the work can in his opinion be completed for the amount proposed to be borrowed, shall be submitted to and be subject to approval by the Governor.

5 The Council shall, after providing for such expenses in connection Appropriation of with the said public hall as are usual and reasonable, from time to time appropriate and apply all the revenue from the public hall land and ground. appropriate and apply all the revenue from the public hall, land, and premises in or towards repayment of the said loan, or payment of any interest, or other moneys payable in respect of the said loan.


6 It shall be lawful for the Council once in every year to make and Power of Council levy a separate local rate of not exceeding Sixpence in the Pound upon the annual value of all properties within that portion of the Lunawanna Ward which is situate to the north and east of the property now occupied by W. H. Vaughan, as shown by the assessment roll in force for the time being, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest and any moneys required for a sinking fund in respect of the said loan. Any such separate local rate shall be made upon and be payable by the persons who would be liable to be rated in respect of the properties included in the municipality if such rate were a general rate under "The Local Government Act, 1906," and shall be made and recoverable in the same manner as any such general rate.

to levy rate.

7 In addition to any other remedy for the recovery thereof, all Security. moneys paid to the Council on account of the loan authorised by this Act, shall until repayment, and all interest from time to time due in respect thereof, shall until payment thereof to the State Treasurer be and remain a first charge upon the said public hall and the land upon which the same is erected, in priority to all liabilities of the Council.

8 The loan authorised by this Act shall be made on and subject to Loan to be such terms and conditions as to insurance of buildings as the Governor subject to may impose or approve in all respects.
