ANALYSIS.

1. Short title and incorporation.

AN ACT to authorise the Purchase by the State of certain Land and Premises in the City of Melbourne for the purposes of the *Tourist Bureau Act 1934*, and the Borrowing of a Sum not exceeding £48,000 for that purpose. [15 May, 1945.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Tourist Bureau (Melbourne Office Purchase) Act 1945*.

(2) This Act shall be incorporated with the *Tourist Bureau Act 1934**, in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2—(1) For the purposes of the Principal Act, the Minister may purchase and acquire, for and on behalf of His Majesty, the land and premises situated at and known as number 254 Collins Street in the City of Melbourne in the State of Victoria, at a price not exceeding £45,000.

(2) The said land and premises shall be conveyed or transferred to and be held by such person or body on behalf of His Majesty as the Minister directs.

(3) The said land and premises shall be used for the purposes of the Principal Act and such other purposes as the Minister directs, and, subject to the supervision of the Minister, shall be under the control and management of the Director.

(4) The Minister may let to any person any portion of the said premises, which is not required for the purposes of the Principal Act, on such terms as he thinks fit.

3 The Minister may expend such sum, not exceeding £2000, as he thinks necessary in making such alterations or additions to the said premises as may be required, in the opinion of the Minister, to enable them to be used for the purposes of the Principal Act or this Act.

Power to
borrow
£48,000.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £48,000 for the purposes of this Act (including any costs or expenses incidental to the purchase of the said land and premises).
