

AN ACT to make provision for the Purchase 1909. and Improvement of Public Recreation Grounds at Burnie. [30 December, 1909.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Burnie Recreation Grounds Act, Short title. 1909."
- 2 In this Act "Council" shall mean the Warden, Councillors, and Interpretation, electors of the Municipality of Emu Bay.

Burnie Recreation Grounds.

A.D. 1909.

Power of Council to purchase land for recreation ground, and borrow £2500 for that purpose.

3 It shall be lawful for the Council to purchase the pieces of land in the town of Burnie described in the First Schedule hereto, or either of them, for public recreation purposes, and each of such pieces of land when so purchased as aforesaid shall be a public recreation ground within the meaning of "The Public Recreation Grounds Act, 1888." It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to borrow any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole Two thousand five hundred Pounds, for the purpose of defraying the costs of purchasing such pieces of land, or either of them, for the purposes of public recreation as aforesaid, and of improving the same when purchased.

Power for Governor in Council to grant loan under "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890."

4 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to grant, in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," and the amendments thereof, any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of Two thousand five hundred Pounds, as a loan or loans to the said Council for the purpose of defraying the costs of purchasing and improving the said pieces of land, or either of them, for the purpose of public recreation as aforesaid; and such sum or sums of money shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose: Provided that it shall not be necessary to lay before either House of Parliament plans and specifications of any proposed works nor the report of the Engineer-in-Chief thereon, as provided by Section Two of the said Act; but before any part of the said moneys shall be advanced to the Council, full particulars of the purposes for which it is required shall be submitted to, and approved by, the Governor in Council.

Poll to be taken before borrowing.

5 The Council shall not proceed in the matter of purchasing the said pieces of land, or either of them, or of borrowing any sums of money under the authority of this Act, until after a poll has been taken of the electors of the Municipality of Emu Bay for the purpose of ascertaining whether the Council shall be permitted to proceed in the matter of purchasing such land and borrowing such moneys, unless at the taking of such poll a majority of the votes shall be in favour of the Council proceeding to purchase such land and to borrow any such money: Provided that, in the event of there not being the necessary number of votes recorded at such poll in favour of the Council purchasing such land and borrowing such money, the Council may at any time after the expiration of Three months cause another poll to be taken; and if at any such subsequent poll the necessary number of votes is obtained, the Council may proceed to purchase such land and to borrow such money.

Manner of poll.

6 Every poll of electors taken under the provisions of this Act shall be taken in the same manner as a poll in the Municipality of *Emu Bay* for the election of members of the Council, and every elector shall be entitled to the same number of votes as the number which he is entitled to use at an election of a member of the Council, and the ballot-papers

to be used in the taking of such poll shall be in the form set forth in A.D. 1909. the Second Schedule to this Act.

7 When the Council shall decide to take a poll of the electors as Poll to be aforesaid they shall cause an advertisement of such poll to be inserted advertised, not less than Three times in a daily newspaper circulating in the town of *Burnie*, and in One number of the *Gazette*, and such advertisement shall contain the following particulars:—

I. Time and place of such poll:

II. A short description of the land proposed to be purchased, and the purposes for which it is to be used:

III. The amount of purchase-money proposed to be paid for the said lands, and the amount intended to be spent in improvements:

iv. The amount proposed to be borrowed.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

(a) All that piece or parcel of land situate and being in the township of South Burnie, and bounded as follows:—Commencing at the angle of Strahan and Hale streets by a line 5 chains south-westerly along Hale-street and thence by a line 8 chains south-easterly along Wellington-street thence by a line 5 chains north-easterly along Hopkinson-street and thence by a line 8 chains north-westerly along Strahan-street to the point of commencement containing 4 acres more or less.

(b) All that piece of land containing 10 acres, be the same a little more or less, and being the western portion of 14 acres or thereabouts of land situate at Burnie aforesaid known as the Parsonage Reserve (such western portion to be surveyed at the joint expense of the trustees of the property of the Church of England and the Council in such a way as not to interfere with the parsonage and outbuildings now used in connection therewith, and being the land comprised in lease dated the 19th day of March, 1907, from the said trustees to the Board and electors of the Town of Burnie.
