

AN ACT to make provision for the Marine A.D. 1874. Survey of Banks' Straits. [18 September, 1874.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for a contribution to the PREAMBLE. cost of a Marine Survey of Banks' Straits:

And whereas it has been agreed between the Government of the Colony of Victoria and the Government of Tasmania that the proportion of the cost of such Survey to be borne by the Government of Tasmania shall be a sum not exceeding Three thousand Pounds:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Levislative Council and

by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—.

- 1 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause a Marine Marine Survey Survey of Banks' Straits to be made in conjunction with the of Banks' Straits. Government of the Colony of Victoria, and by and under the supervision of the Admiralty Surveyors.
- 2 A proportion of the cost of such Survey, not exceeding Three Defrayment of thousand Pounds, shall be borne by this Colony, and shall be defrayed cost. out of the moneys to be hereafter provided by Parliament.
 - 3 This Act may be cited as "The Banks' Straits Survey Act." Short title.
