

AN ACT to further amend "The Constitution A.D. 1890.

[Reserved, 28 November, 1890; Royal Assent proclaimed, 27 April, 1891.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Constitution Act" in PREAMBLE. certain particulars:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act imay be cited as "The Constitution Amendment Act, Short title. 1890." [MOJEAO EXTREM.]
- 2 Section Sixteen of "The Constitution Act" is hereby repealed, Provision and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as Section Sixteen of the said Act, (that is to say)—

 Sect. 16 of 18 Vict. No. 17.

"Every Assembly hereafter to be summoned and chosen shall continue for Three years from the day of the return of the Writs for choosing the same and no longer, subject nevertheless to be sooner dissolved by the Governor."

3 "The Constitution Act" and the Acts amending the same, save Acts to be read as altered or amended by this Act, and this Act, shall be read and together construed together as one Act.
