AN ACT to further amend "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1861." A.D. 1896.
[30 October, 1896.]

WHEREAS there is danger of the Tick being introduced into *Tasmania* in straw or grass used as packing: **PREAMBLE.**

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1896." **Short title.**

2 No fruit, plants, or other products shall be imported or brought into *Tasmania* packed in grass, straw, or any material calculated to introduce into *Tasmania* the *Queensland Cattle-tick (Ixodes bovis)*; and any person acting in contravention of this Section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred Pounds. **Penalty on importing fruit, &c. packed in straw, &c.**

3 Any case or other receptacle containing any fruit, plants, or other products packed as aforesaid, may, on being landed from any ship in *Tasmania*, be detained by the Chief Inspector or any person appointed by him, or any Inspector, and every such case or other receptacle and all the contents thereof may be destroyed at the expense of the person importing the same. **Fruit, &c. may be detained and destroyed.**

4 This Act and "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1861," and the Acts amending the same, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act. **Acts to be read together.**
