AN ACT to amend "The Contagious Diseases 1909. (Cattle) Act, 1861," and for other purposes. [30 December, 1909.]

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows : --

1 This Act may be cited as "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1909," and shall be incorporated with and read as one with "The incorporation with Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1861," and its amendments.

2 The following Acts are hereby repealed, namely :---" The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1900," and "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1903."

Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Amendment.

A.D. 1903.

Repeal and re-enactment of Section Six of 44 Vict. No. 12. **3** Section Six of "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1880," is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted in lieu thereof :---

"6-(1) All cattle brought into this State from any other State of the Commonwealth, other than for slaughter, shall-

- 1. Be accompanied with certificates showing that they are bred from herds that have been immune from disease for a period of Three years immediately prior to the shipment of the cattle :
- II. On arrival be landed at or on such quarantine ground as an inspector directs : and
- 111. Be detained at the quarantine ground for such period as the Chief Inspector appoints, not being less than Ninety days from the landing thereof.

Penalty.

"(2.) Every person who lands or causes to be landed any such cattle contrary to any provision of this section shall upon conviction in a summary way be liable to a penalty of not less than Fifty Pounds and not exceeding Two hundred Pounds."
