

AN ACT to repeal "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1918," and to validate certain Collections, Payments, and Liabilities purporting to have been made or incurred thereunder, and for other purposes.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, Short title. 1921."

3 All cattle taxes levied and collected in the Municipalities of Table Cape and Circular Head, and all payments made and liabilities incurred by the Councils of the said Municipalities or either of them, under or in pursuance of the authority, or supposed authority, of the said Act hereby repealed, shall be deemed to have been lawfully levied, collected, made, and incurred respectively, and no action suit or other proceeding shall be brought or maintained against the said Councils, or either of them, or any person employed by them, or either of them, in respect of any such levy or collection as aforesaid.

4—(1) It shall be lawful for the said Councils of the said Municipalities of Table Cape and Circular Head to pay and discharge, out of the respective Municipal Funds of the said Municipalities, the liability of One hundred and twenty-seven Pounds Six Shillings and Fourpence, incurred by the said Councils in respect of the premises, together with all interest payable in respect thereof, up to the commencement of this Act.

(2) Such moneys shall be paid by the said Councils in such proportions as may be determined by agreement adopted by resolution of such Councils respectively.
