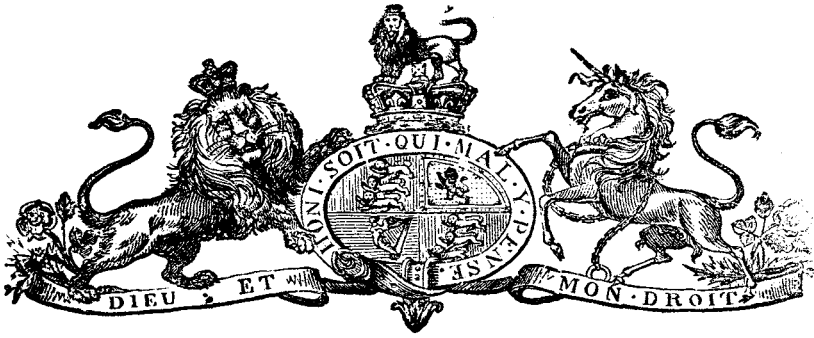

AN ACT to further amend "The Customs Duties Act, 1880." [29 October, 1883.] A.D. 1883.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines, the expression "the said Act" means "The Customs Duties Act, 1880." Interpretation. 43 Vict. No. 11.

2 On and after the First day of *January*, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, there shall be raised, levied, collected, and paid upon the importation into *Tasmania* of the several articles, goods, wares, and merchandise mentioned in the Schedule (1) to this Act the several duties therein set forth instead of the duties imposed thereon by the said Act. Duties on certain goods.

All such articles, goods, wares, and merchandise as are mentioned in the said Schedule (1) as may be in any bonding warehouse on and after the said First day of *January*, 1884, or as may be entered to be landed on or after that day, shall be deemed to have been imported within the meaning of the Acts relating to the Customs, and shall be subject and liable to the duties hereby imposed. Articles landed or in bonding warehouse on 1st Jan., 1884, subject to altered duties.

3 The articles, goods, wares, and merchandise set forth in the Schedule (2), shall, unless the same are packed with goods liable to Duty, be exempt from the payment of any Customs Duties on and after the First day of *January*, 1884. Exemptions.

Form of Declaration under sect. 4 of 43 Vict. No. 11.

4 The form in the Schedule (3) is hereby substituted for the form of Declaration in the Schedule (2) of the said Act; and it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to alter the said form of Declaration; and all the provisions contained in Section Four of the said Act shall be applicable in all respects to the form of Declaration hereinbefore mentioned.

If any such Declaration shall be made falsely by any person as the agent, clerk, or servant of the Importer, such Importer shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds; but nothing herein contained shall be held to exempt such agent, clerk, or servant from any penalty to which he may be personally liable in respect of such false Declaration under the said Act.

The Collector shall not be compellable to receive a Declaration made by any person who shall appear to such Collector to be under the age of Sixteen years.

Acts to be read together.

5 "The Customs Duties Act, 1880," and every amendment thereof, save so far as the same may be altered by this Act, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.

Short title.

6 This Act may be cited as "The Customs Duties Amendment Act, 1883."

Bricks, air.	Instruments, Scientific, Optical, and Surgical.	Sewing Machines.
