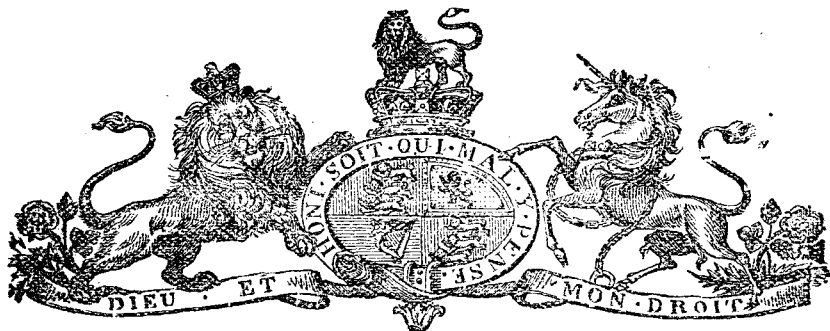

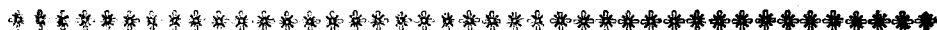

AN ACT to amend "The Customs Duties Act, 1894." [24 October, 1896.] A.D. 1896.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Customs Duties Amendment Act, 1896." Short title.

2—(1.) In any entry inwards of goods liable to pay Duty according to the value thereof, and arriving in *Tasmania* to the order or disposition of any person who is not domiciled in *Tasmania*, the Declaration as to value of such goods shall be made by the person domiciled in *Tasmania* to whom such goods shall have been sold or his agent; and the value of such goods, for the purposes of computing the Duty payable thereon, shall be the amount which such last-mentioned person actually pays for the same, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Customs Duties Act, 1894." Value of goods arriving to the order of person not domiciled in *Tasmania*. 58 Vict. No. 4.

(2.) This Section shall not apply to any *bonâ fide* domiciled resident in *Tasmania*, or to any immigrant bringing goods into *Tasmania* for the purpose of sale, use, or consumption.

3 "The Customs Duties Act, 1894," and this Act shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act. Acts to be read together.
