

AN ACT to provide for the Reinstatement of certain Persons as Purchasers of certain Crown Lands, and to authorise the Governor to convey and alienate certain pieces of Land. [14 December, 1931.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and

1—(1) This Act may be cited as "The Crown Lands Pur-Short title and chasers Reinstatement Act, 1931."

House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

(2) This Act shall be incorporated with the Crown Lands Act, 1911, in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—
"The Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Interpretation. Crown Lands:

"Schedule" means schedule to this Act.

Certain persons whose lands have been forfeited may be reinstated as purchasers.
Schedule (1).

3 The Commissioner, with the consent of the Governor, may reinstate the persons named in Schedule (1) as purchasers of the several lots or areas of land set opposite to their names respectively, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown Lands under which the purchases of such lots or areas were made respectively; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments due upon such lands at the date of forfeiture and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided by Section Ninety-six of the Principal Act, together with interest at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum from the dates when such instalments became due respectively.

Certain persons named in Schedule (2) to be permitted to complete their purchases.

4 The Commissioner may permit the persons named in Schedule (2) to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of Twenty Shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said lands in fee simple to the said persons respectively.

Completion of purchase by Edgar Allen Smith.

5 Subject to Section Ninety-seven of the Principal Act, the Commissioner may permit the payments made by Edgar Allen Smith in respect of those pieces of land containing ninety-nine acres and eight perches and one hundred and four acres three roods eleven perches, situated in the Parishes of Powena and Branxholm respectively, to be applied towards the completion of the purchase of that piece of land containing forty-nine acres three roods twenty-one perches and forming part of the said piece of land containing one hundred and four acres three roods eleven perches.

Power to Commissioner to sell lands to *L*. *H. Davis* and others. Schedule (3).

6 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to Louis Henry Davis, George S. Hutchison, William Salmon, A. L. Mulligan, E. J. Hoodless, Alfred Allen, C. C. Davis, A. Coombe, J. R. Hoodless, and A. H. Davis the Crown land described in Schedule (3) for the sum of One Pound; and, upon payment of the said sum into the Treasury, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land in fee simple to the persons named in this section.

Power to Commissioner to sell lands to *L. M. Hanslow*. Schedule (4).

7 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to Louisa Mary Hanslow the Crown land described in Schedule (4) for the sum of Fifteen Pounds; and, upon payment of the said sum into the Treasury, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land in fee simple to the said Louisa Mary Hanslow.

8 Upon the transfer by the Corporation of the Mayor, A.D. 1931. aldermen, and citizens of the City of Hobart to His Majesty of the piece of land containing three roods thirty-six perches and seven-tenths of a perch, described in Purchase Grant, Registered Volume CLIX., Folio 99, and upon the surrender Corporation. by the said Corporation to His Majesty of the lease dated the Schedules (5) fifth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty- and (6.) two, of the land described in Schedule (5), the proclamation published in the Gazette on the eighteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, excepting from sale and reserving to His Majesty the said land described in Schedule (5), shall be deemed to be revoked; and the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the Crown land described in Schedule (6) to the said Corporation, in fee simple.

Exchange of land with Hobart

9—(1) Upon the repayment to the Treasurer of the amount Power to advanced for the construction of municipal homes on the Governor to lands described in Schedules (7) and (8), together with the grant certain interest accrued due thereon, the Governor may, in the name Hobart and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said Corporation. lands so described, in fee simple, to the Corporation of the Schedules (7) Mayor, aldermen, and citizens of the City of Hobart.

and (8).

(2) Upon the grant by the Governor to the said Corporation of the said lands described in Schedules (7) and (8), the lease dated the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, made between the Governor and the said Corporation, shall be deemed to be surrendered, so far as the same relates to the said lands so described; and the proclamation published in the Gazette on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, excepting from sale and reserving to His Majesty the said lands so described, shall be deemed to be revoked.

10—(1) The Commissioner may let by private contract, for Power to Comany term not exceeding fourteen years, the island described in missioner to Schedule (9), to the persons, and at the rental specified in that schedule.

(2) The lease of the said island shall be granted subject to the provisions of the Principal Act relating to leases of Crown land for grazing purposes.

11 Notwithstanding the provisions of Section Twenty-seven Power to of the Closer Settlement Act, 1929, it shall be lawful for the Minister to Minister to consent to the transfer by James Wilson of a lease permit transheld by him under Part VII. of that Act, in respect of two Closer Settlethousand four hundred and fifty-five acres of land, situated in ment Lease. the district of Oatlands, comprising Lot 6 of the Bowhill Estate, to a person recommended by the Closer Settlement Board, and it shall be lawful for such person to hold such lease.
