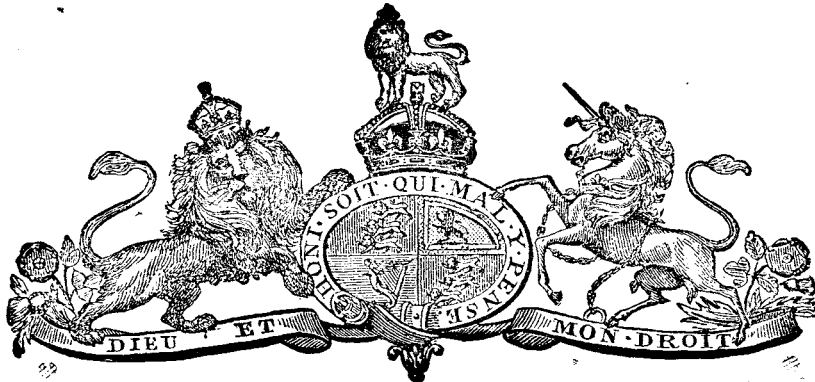

AN ACT to amend the Codlin Moth Act,
1888. [15 January, 1929.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Codlin Moth Act, 1928.”

Short title.

2 The Codlin Moth Act, 1888, is hereby amended by repealing Section Forty, inserted therein by the Codlin Moth Act, 1912, and substituting therefor the following new Section Forty—

“40—(1) Every Board shall have power to impose and levy, Power to annually, a tax at a rate not exceeding Six Shillings for every acre of Board to each orchard in its district. impose tax.

“(2) Where an orchard is of such area that the tax imposed as aforesaid would be less than such minimum sum not exceeding Three Shillings as the Board may declare, the tax payable in respect thereof shall be the minimum so declared.

“(3) Every occupier of an orchard shall pay such tax to the treasurer or collector of the Board.”
