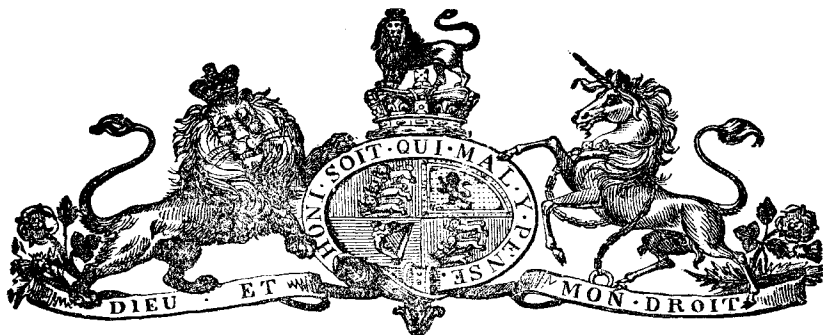

AN ACT to further amend "The Cruelty to Animals Act, 1877." [20 December, 1887.] A.D. 1887.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 The Governor in Council is hereby empowered from time to time to make, alter, and revoke Regulations for the purpose of preventing cruelty to any animal while being landed from or taken on board any vessel, or being transported from place to place in *Tasmania*; and any such Regulations may prescribe penalties not exceeding Five Pounds for every offence against such Regulations. All such Regulations shall be published in the *Gazette*, and shall take effect from a date to be named therein, and after such date shall have the force of Law as if the same had been inserted in this Act.

Governor in Council may make Regulations to prevent cruelty to animals.

2 "The Cruelty to Animals Act, 1877," and every Act amending the same, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.
