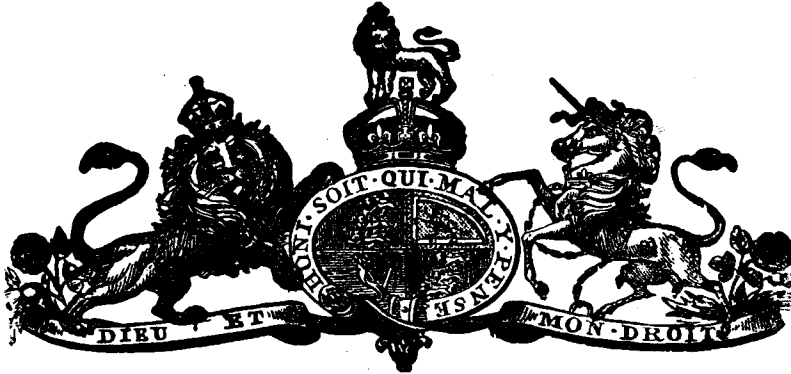

AN ACT to remove Doubts concerning the
Constitution of the Carrick Water District
and the Making of Rates in respect thereof.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of Westbury, on the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, in pursuance of the provisions of Section Nineteen of the Rural Municipalities Amendment Act, 1884, defined the Carrick Local Water District as the same is defined in the schedule to this Act, and notice thereof was published in the Hobart Gazette on the twenty-sixth day of March, and the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine: And whereas the said Municipal Council borrowed moneys and carried out water-works for the purpose of making provision for a water supply within the said local water district, and from time to time made and levied separate local rates to provide for the payment of interest and maintenance costs and charges and the provisions of a sinking fund account: And whereas doubts

have arisen respecting the validity of the defining of the said water district, and the making and levying of the said rates by the said Municipal Council, and it is desirable to remove such doubts:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as “The Carrick Water District Doubts Removal Act, 1926.”

Interpretation.

2 In this Act—

The “Carrick Water District” means the said Carrick Local Water District defined as aforesaid, and being that portion of the Municipality of Westbury contained within the boundaries set forth in the schedule to this Act:

“The Council” means the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Westbury.

3 The Carrick Water District shall be deemed to be, and at all material times to have been, properly defined and constituted, and the separate local rates made in respect thereof to have been properly made and levied under the provisions of the Rural Municipalities Act, 1865.

4 The Carrick Water District shall be deemed to be a water district duly proclaimed under the provisions of Section Two hundred and six of the Local Government Act, 1906, and to be a water district within the meaning and for the purposes of Part XV. of the said Act, and the Council shall have in respect thereof all the powers vested in a council of a municipality in respect of a water district duly proclaimed under the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing on the south from a point on the Liffey Rivulet where such rivulet abuts on the end of a street marked Percy-street and extending easterly along the south side of that street to the south-east corner of the township of Carrick and from thence in a continuous direction to the south-east corner of a certain three hundred acres of land formerly selected by — Popplewell now belonging to Thomas Reibey thence on the east by a line running northerly along such lastmentioned allotment to a road known as the Longford-road thence on the north-east on the boundary of such road extending north-westerly as far as the road leading from Carrick to Launceston from thence continuing in a northerly line across said road and extending as far as the Meander River thence on the north-east on the line of such river extending north-westerly until its junction with the Liffey Rivulet thence on the north-west by the course of that rivulet extending south-westerly to point of commencement.
