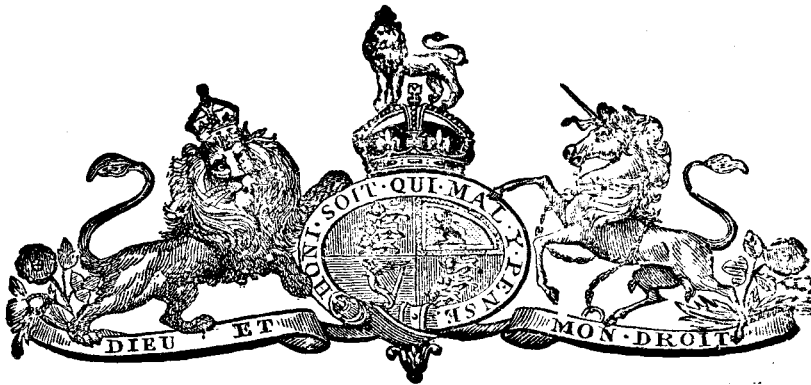

AN ACT to amend the Devonport Lighting Act, 1900, and to authorise a further Loan of Three thousand Pounds to the Municipality of Devonport for Lighting Purposes. A.D. 1928.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Devonport Lighting Act, 1928.” Short title.

Devonport Lighting.

A. D. 1928
 Interpretation.

2 In this Act—

“The Council” means the Council of the Municipality of Devonport :

“The Corporation” means the Warden, councillors, and electors of the Municipality of Devonport :

“The Loans Act” means the State Loans to Local Bodies Act, 1921.

“The said Act” means the Devonport Lighting Act, 1900.

Power to borrow.

3 It shall be lawful for the Council on behalf of the Corporation, in addition to any moneys already borrowed under the said Act, to borrow under the provisions of the Loans Act any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of Three thousand Pounds, for the purpose of defraying the cost and expenses of and incidental to the completion, carrying out, or extension of all or any of the works or objects authorised by the said Act.

Sinking fund.

4 The sum of money payable by the Council as an annual contribution towards a sinking fund in respect of any moneys borrowed under this Act shall be an amount equal to Two Pounds per centum of the moneys so borrowed.

Treasurer
 authorised to

5 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer to borrow, raise, and receive a total sum not exceeding Three thousand Pounds for the purposes of this Act.
