

AN ACT to further amend "The Devonport 1910.

Lighting Act, 1900," and to authorise a further Loan of Four thousand Pounds to the Municipality of Devonport for Lighting Purposes.

[20 December, 1910.]

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality of Devonport has PREAMBLE. decided to extend and apply the system of lighting formulated and adopted under the provisions of "The Devonport Lighting Act, 1900,"

to East Devonport, and for that purpose the statutory number of votes have been recorded in favour of such extension at a poll of the electors of East Devonport duly held under the provisions of "The Devonport Lighting Act, 1907:"

And whereas the said Council is desirous of obtaining legislative authority to increase the amount empowered to be borrowed under "The *Devonport* Lighting Act, 1900," by a sum or sums not exceeding in all Four thousand Pounds:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as "The *Devonport* Lighting Amendment Act, 1910."

Interpretation.

- 2 In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines—
  - "Council" shall mean the Warden, Councillors, and electors of the Municipality of *Devonport*:
  - "East Devonport" shall mean the area defined in "The Devonport Lighting Act, 1907," Schedule (1.):
  - "The said Act" shall mean "The Devonport Lighting Act, 1900."

Power to borrow.

3 It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to borrow any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole Four thousand Pounds for the purpose of extending and applying the system of electric lighting as formulated by the said Act to East Devonport, and also for providing for any expenditure that may hereafter appear necessary to the Council for the alteration or increase of or addition to the electric light plant now installed at West Devonport, and for the extension of the Devonport lighting scheme generally.

Power to lend.

4 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant from time to time in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole Four thousand Pounds, as a loan to the Council for the purposes mentioned in the preceding section, such sum or sums to be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.

Provided that it shall not be necessary to lay before either House of Parliament plans and specifications of the proposed works, nor a report of the Engineer-in-Chief thereon, as provided in Section Two of the lastmentioned Act; but before any part of the said sum of Four thousand Pounds shall be advanced to the Council, plans and specifications of the proposed works, together with a report by the Engineer-in-Chief upon the probable cost thereof, the suitability of the site proposed therefor, the sufficiency of the plans and specifications, and upon such other matters connected with the works as the Engineer-in-Chief may deem it desirable to refer to in his said report, and that the

work can, in his opinion, be completed for the amount proposed to be A.D. 1910 borrowed, shall be submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council.

5 The Council shall not proceed in the matter of borrowing any Poll to be taken. sum of money until a poll has been taken of the electors of the Muni- Two-thirds vote cipality of Devonport who are owners or occupiers of property within needed. the town of Devonport, for the purpose of determining whether the Subsequent poll Council shall borrow the money. If at the taking of such poll a less number than Two-thirds of the votes recorded shall be in favour of the Council's proceeding to borrow, the Council shall not borrow; but the Council may nevertheless at any time after the expiration of Three months cause another poll of the electors to be taken, and if at any subsequent poll Two-thirds of the votes recorded shall be in favour of the Council's borrowing, the Council may proceed to borrow.

6 When the Council shall have decided to take a poll as aforesaid, it Notice to be shall cause a notice that the poll will be taken to be published, not less published in than Fourteen days before the day fixed for the taking of the poll, not "Gazette." less than Twice in a daily newspaper circulating in the Municipality, and in Two consecutive numbers of the "Gazette."

7 The notice shall state the hours during which, and the place at What is to be which, the poll will be taken, and the amount which it is proposed to stated in notice.

8 The voting-paper to be used at the taking of the poll shall be in Form of votingthe form of the schedule, or to the like effect.

9 The number of votes to which each elector is entitled shall be the Voting and same as that to which he is entitled at an election of Councillors, and proceedings same the proceedings at the taking of the poll shall, with any necessary Councillors. changes, be the same as those prescribed by law at an election of Councillors.

10 The expenses of taking a poll shall be defrayed out of the general Expense out of municipal rate.

11 To prevent any doubts or disputes it is hereby enacted that the Provisions of provisions of Part VI. of the said Act, intituled "Lighting Rate," Part VI. of said shall, with such modifications and alterations as may be necessary, apply and relate to, and be exercisable in respect of, not only the moneys borrowed under the authority of the said Act, but also the moneys which may be borrowed under the authority of this Act; and all such moneys granted by way of loan by the Governor shall be deemed a loan to the Council.

The expression "area" throughout the said Act shall mean the town of Devonport.

Incorporation with the Principal Act.

12 This Act and the said Act, save as altered or amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.
