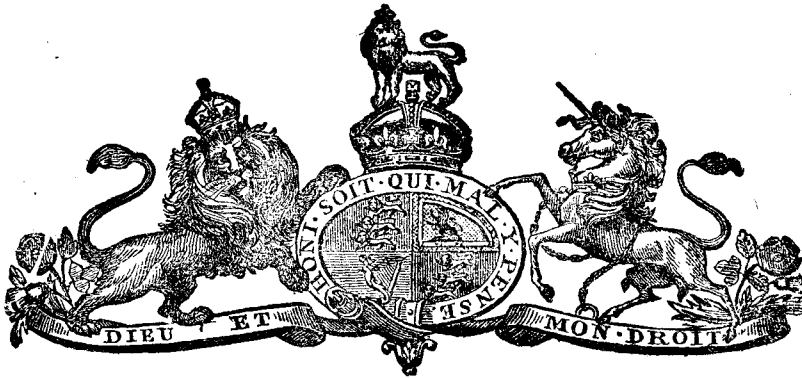

AN ACT to remove Doubts as to the Validity  
of an Appointment to a Certain Office of  
Bailiff. [2 August, 1919.]

WHEREAS *John Thomas Campbell*, of Launceston, in Tasmania, Sheriff's Officer, has on and since the Sixteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, acted in the capacity of a bailiff of the Court of Requests, held at Launceston, under "The Local Courts Act, 1896," and until recently has been regarded as a duly appointed bailiff of such court:

PREAMBLE.

And whereas it is expedient to remove doubts that have arisen respecting the legality of the appointment of the said *John Thomas Campbell*, as such bailiff as aforesaid:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Doubts Removal Act, 1919."

**2** It is hereby declared that *John Thomas Campbell*, of Launceston, in Tasmania, Sheriff's Officer—

- i. Was on the Sixteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, legally appointed a bailiff of the Court of Requests held at Launceston, in Tasmania, and has on and since that date legally and continuously held, and now legally holds, the office of such bailiff, subject to the provisions of "The Local Courts Act, 1896,"; and
- ii. Is removable by the Governor from such office at pleasure.
