

A.D. AN ACT to remove Doubts as to the Validity 1919. of an Appointment to a Certain Office of [2 August, 1919.] Bailiff.

W HEREAS John Thomas Campbell, of Launceston, in Tasmania, PREAMBLE. Sheriff's Officer, has on and since the Sixteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, acted in the capacity of a bailiff of the Court of Requests, held at Launceston, under "The Local Courts Act, 1896," and until recently has been regarded as a duly appointed bailiff of such court :

And whereas it is expedient to remove doubts that have arisen respecting the legality of the appointment of the said John Thomas *Campbell*, as such bailiff as aforesaid :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and
