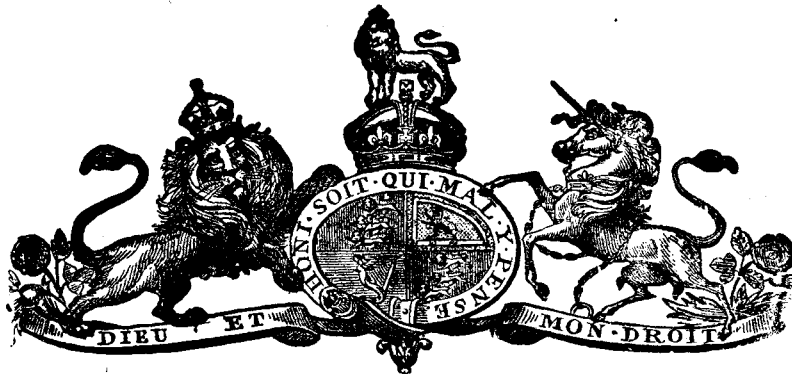

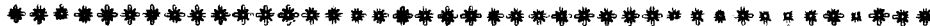

AN ACT to remove Doubts respecting the  
 Liability of Local Authorities in certain  
 cases.

**W**HEREAS doubts have been entertained respecting the liability of local authorities having the control and management of waterworks in the event of such authorities being unable or failing to supply water under certain circumstances, and it is desirable to obviate such doubts : PREAMBLE.  
 Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited for all purposes as “ The Doubts Removal Short title. (Water Authorities) Act, 1915.”

31.**2** In this Act, if not consistent with the context—

“Corporation” means and includes

- i. The Corporation of the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Hobart :
- ii. The Corporation of the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Launceston :
- iii. The warden, councillors and electors of any municipality which has become or may hereafter become a municipality under the provisions of “The Local Government Act, 1906” :
- vi. The trustees of any water district whether such trustees have or have not been declared to be a corporation or corporate body :

“Council” means and includes the council, trustees, or other governing authority of a corporation or of any water district, and shall include the joint council of any united municipality formed under “The Local Government Act, 1906.”

Corporation or council not liable for not supplying water in certain cases.

**3** No corporation or council shall be liable to any penalty or damages for not supplying water if the want of such supply arises from drought or other unavoidable cause or accident, or occurs whilst necessary additions, alterations, or repairs are being effected.
