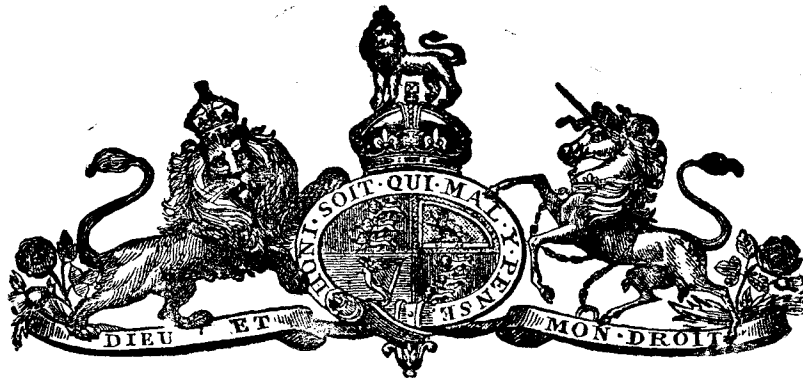

AN ACT to further amend "The Devonport Water Acts, 1889 to 1912," and to authorise a further Loan of Twenty thousand Pounds to the Council of the Municipality of Devonport. [12 January, 1917.]

**W**HEREAS it is desirable to further amend "The Devonport Water Acts, 1889 to 1912": PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as "The Devonport Water Amendment Act, 1916." Short title

3 Geo. V. No. 11.**2** In the construction and for the purposes of this Act—“ Council ” means the Warden, councillors, and electors of  
the Municipality of Devonport :“ The said Acts ” means “ The Devonport Water Acts, 1889 to  
1912.”Council may  
borrow £20,000.**3** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the said  
Acts, it shall be lawful for the Council to borrow any sum or sums of  
money, not exceeding in the whole Twenty thousand Pounds, for the  
purpose of carrying out the objects of the said Acts.Loan of £20,000  
may be granted.**4** It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant in accord-  
ance with the provisions of “ The Local Public Works Loans Act,  
1890,” subject to the provisions of this Act, any sum or sums of money  
not exceeding the sum of Twenty thousand Pounds as an additional  
loan to the said Council for the purpose of carrying out the objects of  
the said Acts ; and such sum or sums of money shall be defrayed out of  
moneys to be provided by Parliament for the purpose : Provided that  
it shall not be necessary to lay before either House of Parliament plans  
and specifications of the proposed works, nor a report of the Engineer-  
in-Chief thereon as provided in Section Two of “ The Local Public  
Works Loans Act, 1890.”Provided that before any part of the said sum of Twenty thousand  
Pounds shall be advanced to the Council the Engineer-in-Chief shall  
have certified that he is satisfied with the manner in which the Council  
proposes to spend the money, and that the work proposed to be effected  
with such money can in his opinion be completed for the amount  
proposed to be borrowed therefor.Provided further that no such loan as aforesaid shall be granted to  
the said Council until all the provisions in the said Acts contained as  
to the taking of a poll of electors of the town before borrowing shall  
have been complied with, and until and after the electors of the town  
have by a majority of votes, at a poll taken for that purpose, consented  
to the Council borrowing such sum of money as aforesaid.Acts to be read  
together.  
Citation of  
Devonport Water  
Acts.**5** This Act and the said Acts shall, save as altered or amended by  
this Act, be read and construed together as one and the same Act, and  
the said Acts and this Act may be referred to and cited for all purposes  
as “ The Devonport Water Acts, 1889 to 1916.”
