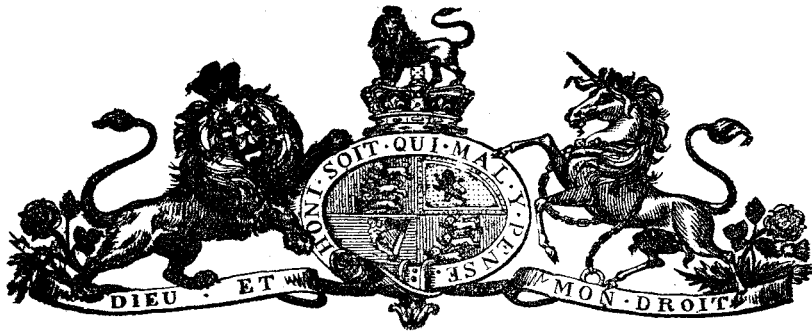

AN ACT to amend "The Electoral Act, A.D. 1893. 1890." [6 November, 1893.]

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient to amend "The Electoral Act, 1890:" PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Electoral Act Amendment Act, 1893." Short title.

2 In this Act the expression "the said Act" shall mean and include "The Electoral Act, 1890." Interpretation. 54 Vict. No. 13.

3 The words, "Montagu One Member," are hereby added to the end of Schedule (2.) of the said Act as a "Southern Assembly District," and the said Schedule (2.) shall hereafter be read and construed as if the said words had been originally part of the said Schedule (2.). Amendment of Schedule (2.) of the said Act.

4 The descriptions and boundaries of the Council Electoral Districts of Derwent, Russell, and Huon, and the descriptions and boundaries of the Assembly Electoral Districts of Cumberland, Wellington, and Franklin, as set forth in the Schedule (3.) of the said Act, are hereby repealed, and the descriptions and boundaries as set forth in the Substitution for portion of Schedule (3.) of 54 Vict. No. 13.

Electoral Amendment.

A.D. 1893.

Schedule (1.) to this Act are hereby enacted in lieu thereof; and the Electoral Districts as specified and described in the said Schedule (1.) shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as Electoral Districts under the said Act, and shall hereafter be read and construed as part of Schedule (3.) of the said Act.

Substitution for portion of Schedule (4.) of 54 Vict. No. 13.

5 The Polling-places as specified in Schedule (4.) of the said Act as the Polling-places of the Assembly Electoral District of *Cumberland* are hereby repealed, and the Polling-places specified in the Schedule (2.) of this Act shall be the Polling-places for the several Electoral Districts mentioned in the said Schedule (2.), and such last-mentioned Schedule shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as part of Schedule (4.) of the said Act.

On passing of Act, Returning Officer for *Montagu* to publish Notice.

6 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the said Act, the Returning Officer appointed for the District of *Montagu* shall, as soon as convenient after the passing of this Act, cause to be published the Notice required by Section Twenty-four of the said Act to be published.

Notice of Claims to vote for *Montagu* may be received up to 7th *December*, 1893.

7 Whenever in the said Act or in any notice to be published thereunder, any Notice of Claim to vote is to be sent to the Returning Officer on or before the Twenty-fourth day of *November* in any year, it shall be sufficient if such Notice of Claim is sent to the Returning Officer appointed for the District of *Montagu* on or before the Seventh day of *December*, 1893; and in making out the List of Claimants required by Section Twenty-nine of the said Act, the said Returning Officer shall include in such List the name of every person who shall on or before the said Seventh day of *December* have claimed to vote as aforesaid.

Claims to vote for *Cumberland* received from persons entitled to vote for *Montagu*.

8 The Returning Officer of the Electoral District of *Cumberland* shall, on or before the said Seventh day of *December*, 1893, forward to the Returning Officer appointed for the Electoral District of *Montagu* all Notices of Claims to vote for the Electoral District of *Cumberland* which he has received from persons who are not entitled to vote for the said District of *Cumberland* but who are entitled to vote for the said District of *Montagu*; and the Returning Officer for the said District of *Montagu* shall insert in the said List of Claimants the names of all persons mentioned in the said Notices of Claims to vote forwarded to him as aforesaid.

Amendments in Section 131, 133, and 136 of 54 Vict. No. 13.

9 The word "Five" in Sections One hundred and thirty-one and One hundred and thirty-six of the said Act, and the word "Seven" in Sub-section Three of Section One hundred and thirty-three of the said Act, are hereby struck out, and the word "Three" substituted for the same respectively. And the said Sections of the said Act shall be read and construed as if the word "Three" had always been inserted therein instead of the words "Seven" and "Five" respectively.

Date of operation of certain Sections.

10 Sections Three, Four, and Five of this Act shall not come into operation until the day upon which the Royal Assent is proclaimed in *Tasmania* to a Bill passed during the present Session of Parliament, intituled "A Bill to further amend *The Constitution Act*;" but every act, matter, and thing required to be done in the preparation of the

Electoral Amendment.

Electoral Rolls and Polling Lists for the Electoral Districts described and mentioned in Schedule (1.) hereto shall be proceeded with as if the said Sections of this Act came into operation upon the passing thereof. A.D. 1893.

The Electoral Rolls and Polling Lists in force upon the passing of this Act, so far as they relate to the Electoral Districts bearing the same names as the Districts described in the Schedule (1.) hereto, shall be and continue in force until the Eleventh day of *April*, 1894; and all elections of Members for the said Electoral Districts which may take place before the said Eleventh day of *April*, 1894, shall be held as if this Act had not passed; and for the purposes of every such Election the boundaries of the said Electoral Districts existing at the time of the passing of this Act shall continue in force, notwithstanding the substitution by this Act of the boundaries of the Electoral Districts specified in the Schedule (1.) in lieu of the boundaries of such Districts specified in the said Act. Existing Rolls continued.

Provided that upon the preparation of the Electoral Rolls and Polling Lists for the District of *Cumberland* as described in Schedule (1.) hereto and for the District of *Montagu* under the provisions contained in the said Bill, intituled "A Bill to further amend *The Constitution Act*," such Electoral Rolls and Polling Lists so prepared shall be used in every Election held between the day upon which they are so prepared and the said Eleventh day of *April*, 1894.

11 This Act and the said Act, as amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act. Acts to be read together.

SCHEDULE.

DESCRIPTIONS AND BOUNDARIES OF ELECTORAL DISTRICTS.

Council District.

DERWENT.

Comprises the Assembly Districts of *Cumberland*, *New Norfolk*, and *Montagu*.

HUON

Comprises the Assembly District of *Franklin* and that portion of the Assembly District of *Kingborough* which is not included in the District of *Buckingham*.

RUSSELL

Comprises the Assembly District of *Wellington*.

Assembly Districts.

MONTAGU.

Bounded by the sea from *Sandy Cape* to the *Mainwaring River*, by that river to its source, from thence to the source of the *Sprent River*, by that river to the *Gordon River*, by that river to the *Franklin River*, by that river to the *Collingwood River*, by that river to its source, thence to the source of the *Murchison River*, by that river to the Electoral District of *Wellington*, and thence by that district to the point of commencement.

WELLINGTON.

Bounded by Bass Strait from Cape Grim to the River Blythe, by that river to the Van Diemen's Land Company's Surrey Hills Block, by part of the north and by the east boundary of that block and by a due south line from its south-east angle for a distance of about twenty-two miles, thence by a westerly line to the Murchison River, by that river to the Mackintosh River, by that river to the Pieman River, by that river to the sea, and thence by the sea northerly to the point of commencement.

The Islands in Bass Strait lying to the west of the 147th degree of longitude form part of this District.

FRANKLIN.

Commencing at the most western point of South Bruni Island, and bounded by the Electoral Districts of Kingborough, Cumberland, and Montagu to the sea, by the sea to Whale Head, and thence by a line across D'Entrecasteaux Channel to the point of commencement.

CUMBERLAND.

Commencing at Platform Bluff and bounded by the Electoral District of Brighton to Lot 863 purchased by W. M. Orr, by the east and part of the north boundaries of that lot, by the east and part of the north boundaries of Lot 69 purchased by Thomas Willison, by part of the east boundary of Lot 864 purchased by Edward Bisdée, by the south boundaries of Lots 2237, 2238, 2869, and 2870, by the west boundary of Lot 477 purchased by John Clark, by the west and part of the north boundaries of Lot 476 purchased by Anthony Fenn Kemp, by a northerly line passing along the east boundary of lands purchased by W. Wylie and D. Wylie, by a continued northerly line to the south boundary of the Parish of Apsley, thence by an easterly line to the north boundary of Lot 289 purchased by W. Robertson, by that boundary to the River Jordan, and thence by the Electoral Districts of Brighton, Oatlands, Campbell Town, Cressy, Deloraine, West Devon, and Montagu to the Gordon River, by that river to the Serpentine River, by the last-mentioned river to Lake Pedder, thence by the south-west shore of that lake and by a south-easterly line to the Huon River, thence by that river to its source, thence by a north-easterly line to the source of Russell's Falls River, and thence by the Electoral District of New Norfolk to the point of commencement.
