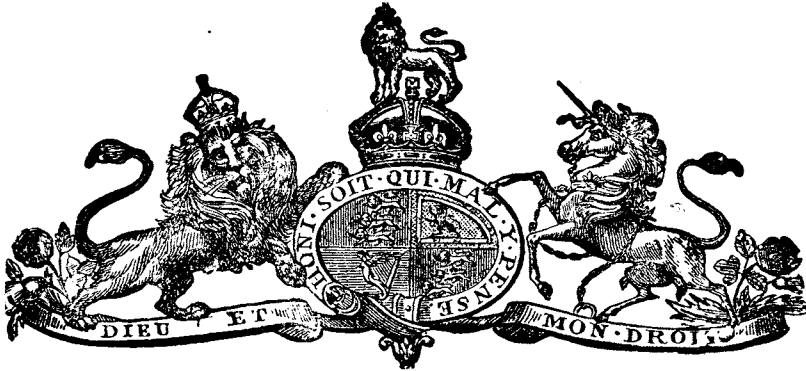

1. Short title and incorporation.
2. Amendment of Principal Act increasing loan to £2700.

AN ACT to authorise the further loan of Seven hundred Pounds to the Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the Municipality of Esperance in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," and for other purposes.

WHEREAS a poll of the electors of an area defined by the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Esperance and shown in the schedule to "The Esperance Municipality Loan Act, 1913," was taken on the Twenty-third day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, to ascertain whether the electors were in favour of the Council borrowing an additional sum not exceeding Seven hundred Pounds for

the purpose of constructing the Public Hall, referred to in "The Esperance Municipality Loan Act, 1913," of brick instead of wood, and at such poll the question was decided in the affirmative, the votes being recorded as follows:—One hundred and twenty-six in favor and Twenty-one against :

And whereas the said Council has duly passed a special resolution authorising the Council to borrow the sum of Seven hundred Pounds in addition to the loan of Two thousand Pounds authorised by "The Esperance Municipality Loan Act, 1913," for the purpose of completing the building of the said hall in brick and furnishing the same :

And whereas the said poll so held and resolution so passed are sufficient for the purposes of this Act :

And whereas the Engineer-in-Chief for the State of Tasmania has, in accordance with Section Four of "The Esperance Municipality Loan Act, 1913," given his certificate bearing date the Eighth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, that in his opinion the proposed works can be completed for the sum of Two thousand seven hundred Pounds :

And whereas it is desirable to amend "The Esperance Municipality Loan Act, 1913," by increasing the loan authorised by that Act from Two thousand Pounds to Two thousand seven hundred Pounds :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Short title and

1 This Act may be cited as "The Esperance Municipality Loan Amendment Act, 1914," and shall be incorporated and read as one with "The Esperance Municipality Loan Act, 1913," in this Act called the Principal Act.

Amendment of
Principal Act
increasing loan
to £2700.

2 The Principal Act is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words "Two thousand Pounds" wherever occurring throughout that Act, and substituting therefor the words "Two thousand seven hundred Pounds."

This amendment shall have a retroactive effect as if it had been made at the commencement of the Principal Act.
