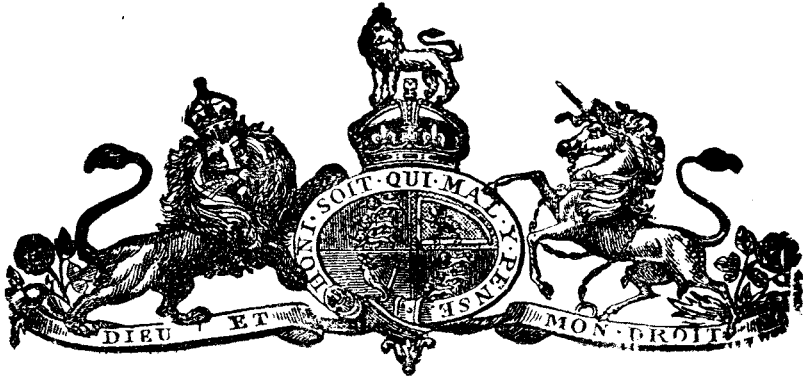

AN ACT to amend the Food and Drugs Act, 1910. A.D. 1929.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

2 The Food and Drugs Act, 1910, is hereby amended—

I. By repealing Section Thirteen thereof, and substituting therefor the following new Section Thirteen :—

“**13**—(1) No person shall—

i. Sell any milk which is adulterated by the addition thereto of any substance as set forth in Paragraph 1. of Section Five of this Act :

Penalty : minimum, Ten Pounds ; maximum, Fifty Pounds.

ii. Sell any milk which does not comply with the prescribed standard :

Penalty : minimum, Two Pounds ; maximum, Fifty Pounds.

(2) Upon the conviction of any person for a third or subsequent offence against Paragraph 1. of Subsection (1) of this section, the magistrate may order that the licence under which such person is entitled to sell milk be cancelled.

(3) No person shall sell any article of food, or any drug, which is adulterated or falsely described or which is packed or enclosed for sale in any manner contrary to the provisions of this Act.” : and

II. By deleting the words “or any two or more justices” in the fourth and fifth lines of Section Forty-five thereof.
