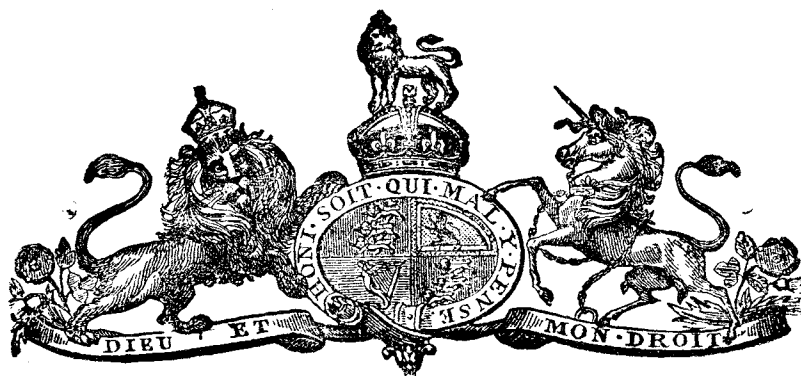

AN ACT to validate certain Expenditure incurred by Public Bodies in connection with the Recent Floods.

**W**HEREAS as a result of the recent floods and abnormal rains which occurred in this State certain public bodies incurred certain expenditure, which, though fully justified by the unusual circumstances, was beyond the scope of the authority conferred upon them respectively: Preamble.

And whereas it is desirable to validate the expenditure so incurred and to authorise the payments in connection therewith from the funds of the several bodies :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as “The Flood Expenditure Validation Act, 1929.” Short title.

**2** This Act shall apply to every municipal council, marine board, and other body of a public or semi-public nature constituted under statutory authority.

**3**—(1) Subject to Subsection (3) of this section, the expenditure incurred by any public body to which this Act applies during the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, in relation to the recent floods and abnormal rains which occurred in this State, is hereby validated, and it shall be lawful for every such public body to make the necessary payments out of its funds in order to discharge the liability of such body in connection with such expenditure.

(2) All such payments made by any such body before the commencement of this Act are hereby declared to have been lawfully made.

(3) The expenditure validated and the payments authorised by this section shall not exceed in the case of the Corporation of the City of Launceston the sum of Two thousand Pounds or in any other case the sum of Two hundred Pounds
