AN ACT to further amend the Franklin Light- 1927. ing Act, 1913.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as "The Franklin Lighting Act, Short title.
- (2) The Franklin Lighting Act, 1913, is herein called "the Principal Principal Act. 4 Geo. V. No. 32 Act."

Franklin Lighting.

Substitution of new area for light district. 15 Geo. V. No. 74. 2 The area of land shown in the plan in the schedule to this Act, and in such plan surrounded by red boundary lines, shall, from and after the commencement of this Act, be and form the light district for the purposes of the Principal Act, in substitution for the area of land shown in the plan referred to in Section Four of the Franklin Lighting Act, 1925.

Power to borrow £2500 under the State Loans to Local Bodies Act, 1921.

- 3—(1) It shall be lawful for the Council, on behalf of the Corporation, without having previously passed any special resolution for the purpose, to borrow under the provisions of the State Loans to Local Bodies Act, 1921, in addition to any moneys previously borrowed under the authority of the Principal Act or amendments thereof, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Two thousand five hundred Pounds, for the purpose of defraying the costs and expenses incidental to the preparation and passing of this Act and the carrying out of the provisions of the Principal Act and this Act.
- (2) All moneys borrowed under the authority of this section shall, for the purpose of Part VII. of the Principal Act, be deemed to have been borrowed under the Principal Act.

Poll to be taken.

- 4 Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act to the contrary—
 - 1. The Council shall not proceed in the matter of borrowing any sum of money under the authority of this Act until a poll has been taken of the electors of the Municipality of Huon, who are the owners or occupiers of property within the light district, for the purpose of ascertaining whether the Council, shall be permitted to so proceed; and
 - 11. Sections Forty-five, Forty-six, and Forty-seven of the Principal Act shall apply to and in respect of the aforesaid poll, and the taking and effect thereof, and for those purposes such sections shall be deemed to be incorporated in this Act.

Sinking fund,

5 The amount payable by the Council as an annual contribution towards a sinking fund in respect of any moneys borrowed under this Act shall be an amount equal to Two Pounds per centum of the moneys so borrowed.

Treasurer authorised to raise £2500.

6 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer to borrow, raise, and receive a total sum not exceeding Two thousand five hundred Pounds for the purposes of the Principal Act and this Act.
