

AN ACT to amend the Law with reference to A.D. 1876. the Falsification of Accounts.

[20 November, 1876.]

W HEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law so as to punish the PREAMBLE. falsification by clerks, officers, servants, and others of their employers' accounts, books, writings, or documents:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:

1 If any clerk, officer, or servant, or any person employed or acting Punishment for in the capacity of a clerk, officer, or servant, shall wilfully, and with falsification of intent to defraud, destroy, alter, mutilate, or falsify any book, paper, accounts, &c. writing, valuable security, or account which belongs to or is in the possession of his employer, or has been received by him for or on behalf of his employer, or shall wilfully and with intent to defraud make or concur in making any false entry in, or omit or alter, or concur in omitting or altering, any material particular from or in any such book or any document or account, then in every such case the person so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to be imprisoned for a term not exceeding Seven years.

- 2 It shall be sufficient in any information under this Act to allege a Allegation of general intent to defraud, without naming any particular person intent to defraud. intended to be defrauded.
- 3 This Act shall be read as one with the Act of the Parliament of Acts to be read Tasmania of the 27th Victoria, No. 8. together.
- 4 This Act may be cited as "The Falsification of Accounts Act, Short title. 1876."
