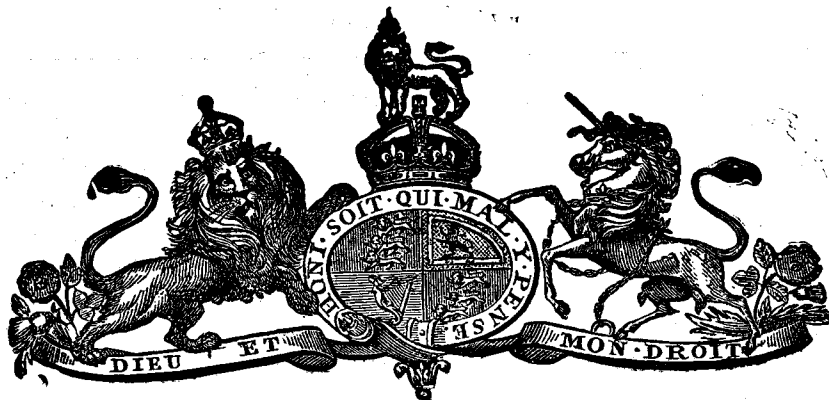

AN ACT respecting a certain Branch of the
Zeehan to North-East Dundas Tramway.
 [13 January, 1911.]

WHEREAS a branch line of tramway has been constructed for a length of One mile Thirty chains or thereabouts, from the *Zeehan* to *North-East Dundas* Tramway to a terminus known as *Griffith* (formerly known as *Wallace's Find*), out of moneys provided by Parliament for the purpose :

PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Griffith Tramway.

Interpretation.

2 In this Act "the said branch tramway" means the branch tramway extending from a point on the *Zeehan to North-East Dundas* Tramway to a terminus known as *Griffith*, and includes any extension thereof or branch thereto, and also includes all works, buildings, stations, and erections erected on or connected with the said branch tramway and any such extension or branch, and also the land upon which the same are, or may be, respectively erected or built, all land used in connection therewith, and all plant, rolling-stock, steam-engines, machinery, and carriages used with the same.

3 The said branch tramway shall be deemed to be a "railway" within the provisions of "The Railway Management Act, 1891," and every amendment thereof, and shall be subject to all the provisions of such Act and its amendments.
