

TASMANIAN GOVERNMENT INSURANCE.

No. 28 of 1952.

AN ACT to amend the *Tasmanian Government Insurance Act 1919.* [17 October, 1952.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Tasmanian Government Insurance Act 1952.*

(2) The *Tasmanian Government Insurance Act 1919*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 After section thirty-one of the Principal Act the following section is inserted in Part III. :—

Power of General Manager to purchase or build premises for transacting business.

“31A.—(1) The General Manager, with the approval of the Minister, may, in his official style and capacity, out of moneys invested under section twenty-eight—

I. Purchase any building: or

II. Purchase any land and build thereon offices, for the purposes of this Act, and may purchase any furniture or fittings which he may consider necessary for use therein.

(2) Any building purchased or built in pursuance of this section may contain office accommodation and other accommodation in excess of the requirements of the Tasmanian Government Insurance Office.

(3) Any such excess accommodation may be let at rents approved by the Minister.

(4) Any rent arising from any such letting shall be paid into the Tasmanian Government Insurance Account and may be recovered either under section twenty-six or by the General Manager in any other way available to landlords.

Certain payments appropriated.

3 Section thirty-three of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after the word “Crown” the words “or the General Manager.”.
