AN ACT to consolidate and amend the Laws 1907. relating to the Protection of Game, and for other purposes. [5 December, 1907.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to consolidate and amend the laws PREAMBLE. relating to the protection of game:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Game Protection Act, 1907."

Short title.

2—(1.) The Acts mentioned in the Schedule (1.) are hereby repealed. Repeal. (2.) All proclamations published pursuant to the provisions of any Act hereby repealed, and in force at the time of the commencement of this Act, and not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, shall continue in force as if published under this Act, and may be revoked wholly or in part by the Governor.

3 In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines—

"Carcase" includes any part of a carcase:

"Crown land" means land which is or may become vested in the Crown, and which is not granted or lawfully contracted to be granted in fee simple; and includes all land which is or may be held for mining, pastoral, or other purposes under any lease, licence, or other right, by or from the Crown, or any person on behalf of the Crown:

"District" means any municipality:

"Hunt" includes to kill, take, pursue, or capture in any manner whatsoever:

"Imported game" means and includes Wonga Wonga Pigeon (Leucosarcia picata), Pheasants, Partridges, and Grouse, whether the same are alive or dead and any other bird or animal which the Governor by proclamation as hereinafter provided declares to be imported game:

"Kangaroo" means the Brush and Forester Kangaroo of Tasmania, but does not include the Forester Kangaroo (Macropus

major):

"Mutton Bird" means the Short-tailed Petrel (Puffinus tenuiros-

tris)

"Native game" means and includes Wild Ducks (other than Musk Ducks), Teal, Widgeon, Quail, Plover, Black Swans, Wattle Birds, Cape Barren Geese, Bronze-winged Pigeons, and Brush Bronze-winged Pigeons, whether such birds are alive or dead, and any other bird, whether such bird is alive or dead, which the Governor by proclamation as hereinafter provided shall declare to be native game:

"Opossum" includes every animal of the family Phalangerinæ, of which the "Black Opossum" and the "Grey Opossum," are the best known representatives in Tasmania, but does not include the "Flying Squirrel" or "Opossum Mouse," nor

the "Ringtailed Opossum':"

"Police magistrate" includes a stipendiary magistrate and the warden of a municipality:

"Quail" includes the bird usually called the Californian Quail:

"Tasmania" includes the dependencies thereof.

Other birds or animals may be included in term "imported game" or "native game." Ibid., s. 4. 4 It shall be lawful for the Governor, by proclamation, to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in the term "imported game" or "native game;" and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Gazette*, and after the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the commencement thereof, the bird or animal so named shall be included in the term "imported game" or "native game," as the case may be.

5 If any person kills or takes any imported game, or uses any dog, gun, net, snare, or other engine or instrument for the purpose of killing or taking any such game, he shall for every head of imported game so

killed or taken, and for every such offence of so using any dog, gun, net, A.D. 1907. snare, or other engine or instrument, incur a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds.

6 If any person buys or sells, or knowingly has in his house, Possession of possession, or control, any imported game, except live game kept or to imported game be kept in a mew or breeding-place, every person shall, for every head of imported game so bought or sold, or found in his house, possession, or control, incur a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds. Nothing herein contained shall extend to any dead imported game brought into this State.

Nothing in this section contained shall prevent any person during the close season killing any Kangaroo or Opossum upon his own land for the boná fide protection of his own crops; but the skin of any Kangaroo or Opossum so killed shall be the property of the Crown,
