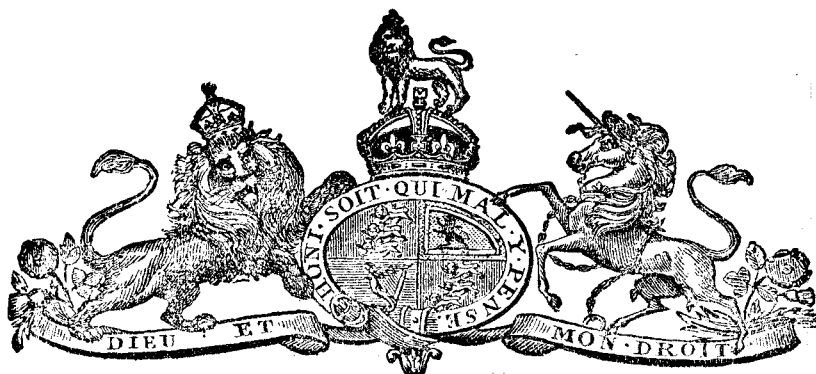

AN ACT to amend the Hobart Corporation Acts, 1893-1924. A.D. 1925.  
[9 December, 1925.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as “The Hobart Corporation Act, 1925.” Short title and incorporation.

(2) This Act and the Hobart Corporation Acts, 1893 to 1924, may, together, be cited as “The Hobart Corporation Acts, 1893 to 1925.”

**2** The Acts set forth in the schedule to this Act are hereby repealed Repeal. to the extent specified in the third column of that schedule.

(1) *The Aldermen.*

Extension of term

**3—**(1) The several periods for which the aldermen elected in the months of December in the years one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, respectively, were so elected, are hereby extended to the second Friday in the months of May in the years one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight respectively: Provided that if any extraordinary vacancy occurs through the death, resignation, removal, or disqualification of any aldermen at any time between the commencement of this Act and the annual election in May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, the place of such aldermen shall not be filled up until such annual election.

(2) For the purposes of the last preceding subsection the word "aldermen" shall include any alderman elected to supply an extraordinary vacancy.

Term of office  
and rotations of  
aldermen.

**4—**(1) Every present and future alderman, except as otherwise provided in this Act, and except in the case of aldermen elected to supply any extraordinary vacancy, shall hold office for three years, and shall go out of office at noon on the second Friday in the month of May in the third year following his election, and in the rotation hereinafter declared.

(2) On the day preceding the second Friday in the month of May in each year, an election shall be held to supply the place of those who retire by rotation, and the persons elected shall assume office upon their predecessors going out of office.

(3) The rotation in which the aldermen shall go out of office shall be regulated as follows:—

- i. On the second Friday in the month of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in each third successive year, five aldermen shall go out of office:
- ii. On the second Friday in the month of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in each third successive year, four aldermen shall go out of office:
- iii. On the second Friday in the month of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and in each third successive year, four aldermen shall go out of office.

**5** Section Seventy-five of the Hobart Corporation Act, 1893, is hereby amended by omitting the word "December" in the third line, and substituting the word "May" therefor.

Aldermen may  
resign.

**6** Any alderman who has been elected for any term of three years or to supply any extraordinary vacancy, may resign at any time after the expiration of such term for which he has been elected without incurring any of the penalties provided in Part VIII. of the Hobart Corporation Act, 1893.

*Hobart Corporation.*(2) *The Mayor.*

7—(1) The person holding the position of Mayor of the City of Hobart at the commencement of this Act shall continue as Mayor without a fresh election until the Saturday following the second Friday in the month of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and shall go out of office as Mayor on the election of his successor as hereinafter mentioned.

Extension of term of present Mayor.

(2) On that day the aldermen shall assemble at eleven o'clock in the forenoon at the town clerk's office or such other room in the Town Hall building as shall be selected by the town clerk and notified to the aldermen, and shall close the doors of the said office or room against all other persons except the town clerk and an assistant selected by him from among the clerical staff of the corporation, and shall then and there elect one of their own body to be the Mayor of the City who shall enter on office on election.

Election of Mayor.

(3) The Mayor elected, as provided in the last preceding subsection, shall hold office for one year and shall go out of office as Mayor on the Saturday following the second Friday in the month of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, on which day and the like day in every succeeding year, the aldermen shall, at the time and in the manner aforesaid, assemble and elect one of their own body to be Mayor who shall enter on office on election and shall hold office for one year and shall retire at the end of his year of office on the election of his successor.

(4) *War Memorial.*

8 It shall be lawful for the Council to appropriate and apply out of the revenues of the Corporation such sum or sums of money as the Council may in its discretion deem desirable for the purpose of a contribution towards the War Memorial erected on the site of the Queen's Battery, Queen's Domain, provided that the moneys so appropriated and supplied shall not exceed the sum of One thousand Pounds, and shall be sanctioned by a resolution carried by a majority of the Council at some duly constituted meeting thereof.
