AN ACT to place certain Restrictions on A.D. 1898. Immigration.

[Reserved, 29 October, 1898; Royal Assent proclaimed, 27 February, 1899.]

W HEREAS it is desirable to place certain restrictions on Immi-PREAMBLE. gration:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Immigration Restriction Act, Short title. 1898."
 - 2 In this Act, the expression—

- "Collector of Customs" shall include the principal Officer of Customs at every port or place in Tasmania:
- "Prohibited Immigrant" shall mean any person who is described in Section Four of this Act, and whose immigration into Tasmania is prohibited by this Act.

- **4** The immigration into *Tasmania* is prohibited of any person described in any of the following paragraphs of this Section, namely:-
 - I. Any person who, on being asked to do so by any Collector of Customs, shall fail to write out, in his own handwriting, in the presence of such officer, in some European language, and sign an application to the Chief Secretary of the Colony in the form set out in Schedule (2.) of this Act, or in a form of a similar purport prescribed from time to time by the Governor in substitution of the form set out in the said Schedule:
 - II. Any person being a pauper or likely to become a public charge:

III. Any idiot or insane person:

IV. Any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease of a loathsome or dangerous character: and

v. Any person who not having received a free pardon has, within Two years previously to the time of his arriving in Tasmania, been convicted of a felony or infamous crime, or a misdemeanour involving moral turpitude, and not being a mere political offence.

- 5 Every prohibited immigrant who lands or attempts to land or being found in Tasmania in disregard or evasion of this Act, shall be deemed to have contravened this Act, and shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment for not more than Six Months, and in addition or substitution for such imprisonment, to be removed from Tasmania. 7, No. 13 s. 4. Provided that such imprisonment shall cease for the purpose of the offender being conveyed out of Tasmania, or if he finds Two approved sureties each in the sum of Fifty Pounds for his leaving Tasmania within One Month.
 - 6 Any person who in the opinion of any Collector of Customs is a prohibited immigrant within the meaning of Paragraph One of Section Four of this Act, may by such officer be allowed to be in Tasmania upon the following conditions, namely:

Provided that in the case of a person landing in Tasmania under the provisions of this section, no penalty shall attach to any vessel or the owners of any vessel in which he shall have arrived at any port of Tasmania.

(2.) No penalty shall be imposed under this section on any master or owner of a vessel who proves to the satisfaction of the Court before which the offence is being inquired into that he had no knowledge of any prohibited immigrant being landed from such vessel contrary to the provisions of this Act, and that he took all reasonable precautions to prevent the occurrence of any such offence.

10—(1.) The Collector of Customs may detain any vessel from Collector of which any prohibited immigrant is in the opinion of any such Collector Customs may of Customs landed contrary to the provisions of this Act. (3.) Such detention shall be for safe custody only and shall cease and be discontinued if a bond with Two sufficient sureties to the satisfaction of the Secretary for Customs be given by such master or owners of such vessel for the payment of the amount of any penalty and other sums of money which may be adjudged to be paid for such offence or default under the provisions of this Act.

(4.) If default is made in payment of any such penalty and other sums of money incurred by such master or owners in terms of any conviction adjudging the payment thereof, it shall be lawful for the Collector of Customs to seize such vessel; the like proceedings shall thereupon be taken for forfeiting and condemning such vessel as in the case of a vessel seized and forfeited for breach of any law relating to the Customs, and such vessel shall be sold.

(5.) The proceeds of the sale of such vessel shall be applied first in payment of the amount of such penalty and other sums of money and of all costs incurred in and about such sale and the proceedings leading thereto, and the balance shall be repaid to owners of or other persons

lawfully entitled to such vessel before condemnation and sale.

11 Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act a prohibited immigrant (unless allowed to be in Tasmania under Section Six of this Act) shall not be entitled to a licence to carry on any trade or calling; and any licence granted or acquired in contravention of this Section shall be void.

12 A Collector of Customs may, with the approval of the Secretary for Customs, make a contract with the master, owners, or agent of any vessel for the conveyance of any prohibited immigrant found in Tasmania to a port in or near to such immigrant's country of birth, or in or near to the place from which he set out for Tasmania, and every such immigrant with his personal effects may be placed by any Collector of Customs on board such vessel, and shall in such case, if destitute, be supplied with such sum of money as the Secretary for Customs thinks sufficient to enable him to live for One month according to his circumstances in life after disembarking from such vessel.

13 Every person who wilfully assists any prohibited immigrant to contravene or attempt to contravene any of the provisions of this Act shall be deemed to have contravened this Act.

14 Every Collector and Officer of Customs may, subject to the provisions of Section Six of this Act, prevent any prohibited immigrant from entering Tasmania, and every such collector and officer may take all legal proceedings necessary for the enforcement of the provisions of

15—(1.) The Governor in Council may make regulations for

carrying the provisions of this Act into effect.

(2.) Such Regulations shall be published in the *Hobart Gazette*, and a copy thereof shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament within Fourteen days after such publication if the Parliament is then sitting, and if the Parliament is not then sitting, within Fourteen days of its next meeting; and if disapproval of such Regulations be not
