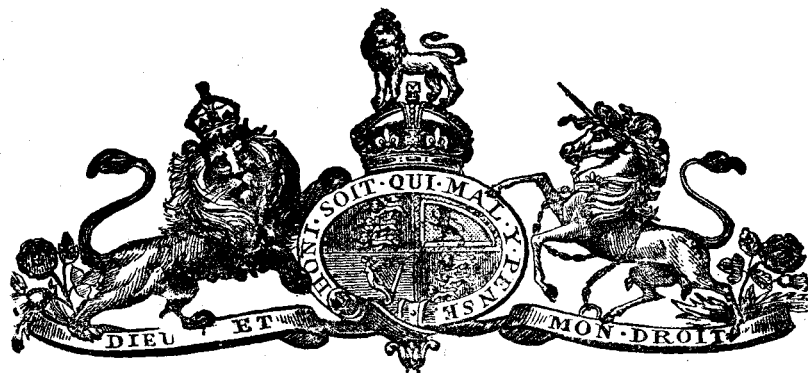

AN ACT to permit Juries to Separate in <sup>A.D.</sup> 1906.  
Cases of Felony. [13 September, 1906.] —

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as “The Juries Separation Act, 1906.” Short title.

**2** Upon the trial of any person for a felony other than murder, treason, or treason felony, the Court may, if it see fit, at any time before the Jury consider their verdict, permit the Jury to separate in the same way as the Jury upon the trial of any person for misdemeanor are now permitted to separate.
